Catholic Board no longer 'Separate'

The word "separate" is now gone from the Halton Roman Catholic School Board.

This is a result of passing Bill 30 which gives full funding to Catholic secondary schools. The new name is Halton Roman Catholic School Board.

According to Cliff Byrnes, director of eduction for the board, this is just a name change.

Before the new law, provincial grants per students in Grades 9 and 10 were \$400 lower in the separate system than the public system. This

has now been equalized and there will now be grants of \$3,445 per student in Grades 11 and 12 this year.

According to Mr. Byrnes, the Catholic board will not get access to the secondary school tax base until 1987. Catholic-school parents will no longer pay tuition fees except for students in Grade 13 this year. The extra funds will not affect programs much this coming school year. Mr. Byrnes said there could be a change in program and facilities in 1987.

On the public school side, Catholicschool representatives on the Halton




