Ask former Halton chief administrator Dennis Perlin what he thinks about being Toronto's chief solicitor and he'll tell you "I love it."

"It's really, really great." Mr. Perlin said he is in a different world now far away from the days when he would debate councillors at Halton over many subjects of civil administration. Now he is in his specialty, law.

"They (council) may take or leave my opinions but they don't argue with

"They don't have the qualifications to challenge a legal opinion.

"When I was CAO, I was really the chief policy advisor.

"But everybody is an administrator. Any citizen's opinion is just as valid in policy formulation. With this job, there is less argu-

Mr. Perlin said that his knowing the limits of the law as a solicitor for

*Halton before becoming CAO helped him greatly in the function as chief administrator. He said his new ob has not been a

big adjustment. He said it is roughly the same as the job he held as solicitor at Halton, albeit the staff is considerably larger. Halton had five lawyers to oversee, Toronto has 80. "But you can't compare the two.

They're two different ballgames. The complexity of the problems is much greater. Whereas in Halton Mr. Perlin was

in charge of a municipality which was developing through new subdivisions. Toronto is fully developed and problems there revolve around rezonings and apartment conversions. His job, he said, is to draft bylaws and give advice to Toronto council and other governmental bodies such as the Toronto Historical Society.

Many issues he faces concern affor-

dable housing. He said the best way to solve that is for the city to buy land and rent commercial space to help subsidize residential rents in the

same complex. Another major problem concerns the railway lands south of the Gardiner Expressway which the city is trying to develop as parkland. And it can go from that to negotiating the terms of lease for Yuppies




