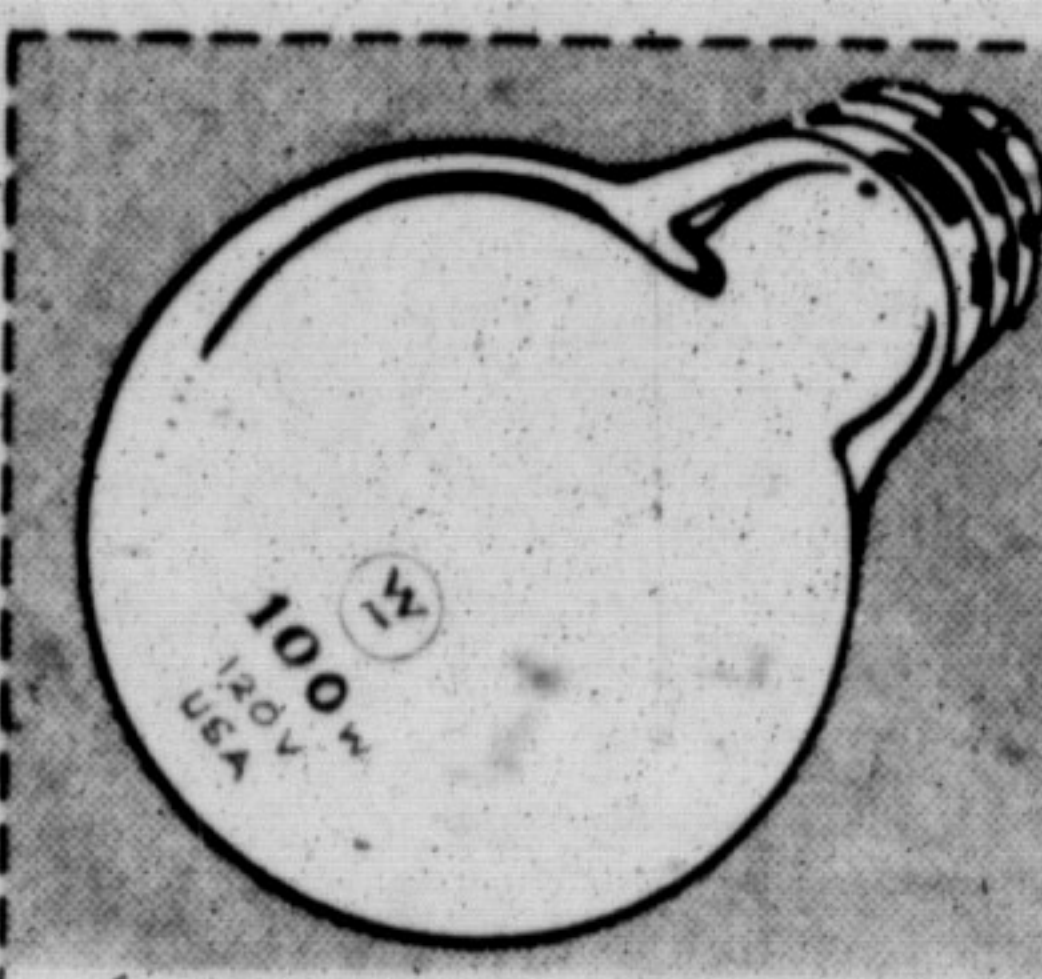

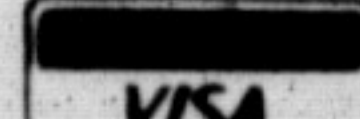
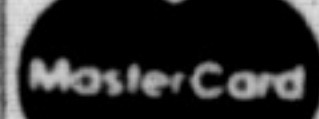

Flood plain mapping set for Nassagaweya

Milton and Nassagaweya residents are invited to attend and give input to a meeting which will involve mapping the areas of Milton within which construction could be banned.

The Halton Region Conservation Authority is hosting the meeting Thursday, Oct. 2 from 3 p.m. at Brookville Hall and is open to the public.

The object is to protect the mutual interests of both the watercourses (Bronte Creek and its tributaries) and the landowners within the watershed. The mapping will set up a regional floodline along creeks and streams. Because the regional floodline is higher than the normal water level it can affect those living nearby.

Once the floodline schedule is completed, no one will be able to build within the floodline boundaries without a permit.

Those who probably are affected will be anyone living near a swamp area or having a stream or creek running through or adjacent to property on which structures are built. This could affect many landowners in the Milton and Nassagaweya area and thus the reason for the public meeting.

The sponsoring Halton Region Conservation Authority also has a brochure available explaining the process. Interested parties can call planner Deborah Ramsey at 878-4131.
