\$150,000 loss in barn fire

Milton Fire Department has pegged the damage caused by a barn fire in Campbellville at \$150,000. The barn was not insured.
Fire destroyed the barn owned by Gino DaRe, on Guelph Line north of Mohawk Raceway in Campbellville, early Monday morning.
Twenty-four fire fighters from all three Milton stations were on hand to battle the blaze which ripped quickly through the steel and wood structure.
They were there for the whole day and saved an office, milk room and garage, attached to the barn, from destruction.
There was no livestock in the barn at the time of the fire, but the DaRe family had to work quickly to get several pieces of farm equipment away from the flames.
Peter DaRe, who was at the scene of the fire, said the barn was in immaculate condition, and had been restored as a show barn. He had no idea what started the fire.

Fatal accident in Milton

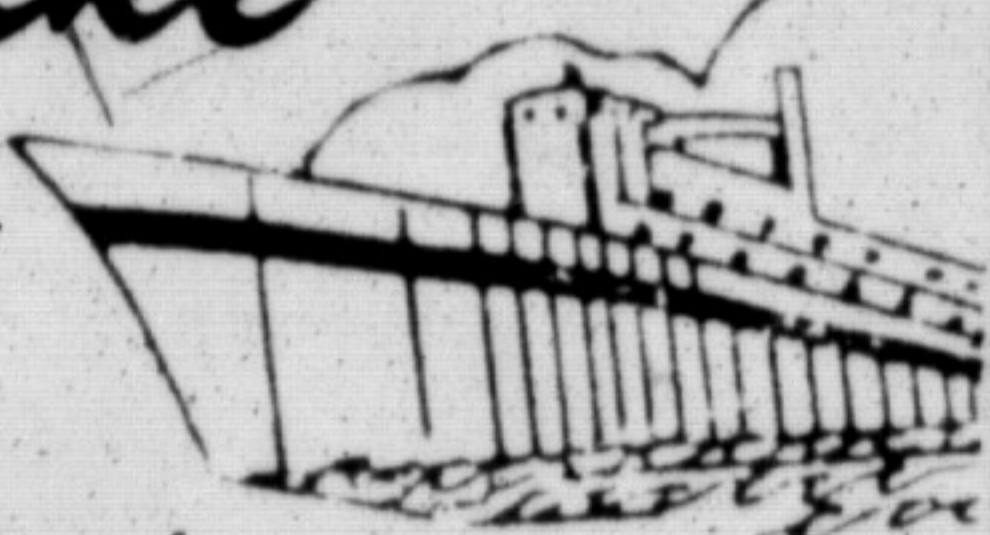
Halton Regional Police are investigating a car accident that claimed the life of an Oakville man early last Friday evening.

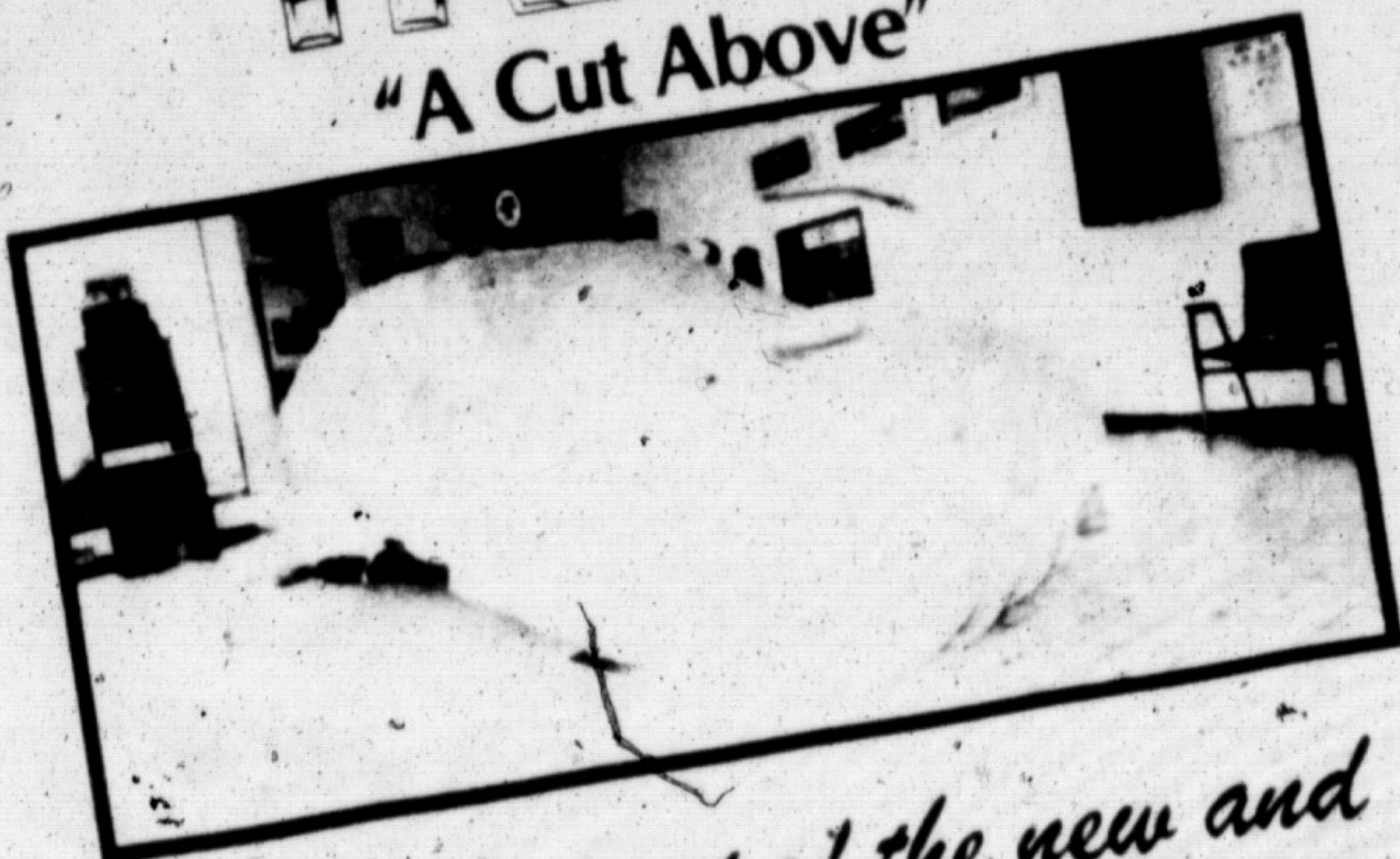

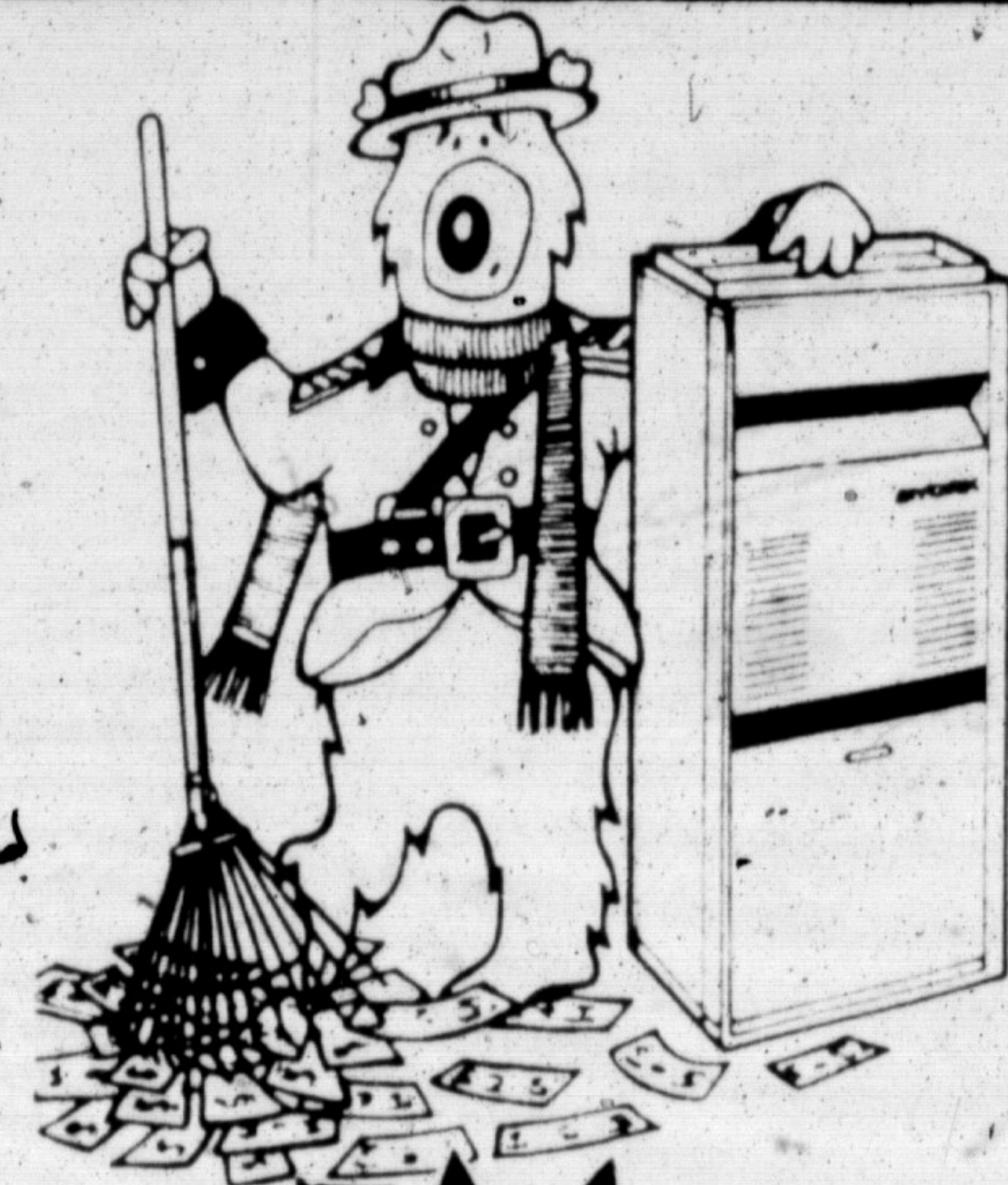
