Public can comment on Ontario St.

The public will be asked to attend an open house Dec. 10 from 3:30-8:30 p.m. at Milton Public Library to review the proposed 1987 reconstruction of Ontario St. from Main St. south to Wakefield Rd.

The road will see the addition of traffic lights between Main St. and Childs Dr.; widening of the roadway by 14 feet; elimination of the "islands" in the middle of Ontario St. at Pine St.; and several other smaller improvements such as "turn-around lanes" on the properties of those living on the east side of Ontario St. near Wakefield. This will

stop the current practice of backing onto Ontario St.

Robert Rook, a consultant with McCormick Rankin Associates, pointed out the single greatest change will be taking out the islands at Pine St. and putting in a new traffic light. This light will be operated by a pushbutton for pedestrians. But what makes the light special is it will be timed to allow a person to cross at a rate of two feet per second. This is 50 per cent slower than normal in order to allow seniors to cross to Milton Mall from the seniors' apartments.

Another consultant in attendance at Monday's general committee meeting, Lyle Malcolm, said the three lights at Main-Pine-Childs will be timed to allow motorists to drive straight through going south in the morning and north in the evening.

On top of that, the road will be widened 14 feet along the east side near the mall by filling in the large drainage ditch. Mr. Malcolm suggested a landscaping plan with extensive use of trees between the road allowance and the mall property.

Snow Parkway tendered Jan. 15

Ontario Transportation and Communication Minister Ed Fulton got Milton council's Christmas list at a special meeting held last Tuesday.

Mr. Fulton came to Milton town hall for a meeting involving himself and MTC employees, and elected and administrative staff from Milton, Halton Hills and Halton Region.

The meeting was arranged by Halton/Burlington MPP Don Knight. It proceeded despite delaying Mr. Knight's fund-raising dinner in Halton Hills back one hour

because the minister was delayed on a flight from Windsor.

The most important item to come out of the meeting was the commitment by the Province to put the James Snow Parkway out to tender on Jan. 14.

Mayor Gord Krantz said Mr. Fulton confirmed the re-built bridge will be a duplicate of the former parkway.

Mr. Krantz said the town also put forward its case for joint provincial funding of the widening of Ontario Street from Steeles Avenue to Derry

Road estimated to cost \$5 million.

"We wanted to impress upon the minister the fact we wouldn't want to start this project and, then find funding was not forthcoming," Mr. Krantz said.

The project would be jointly funded by the Ministry.

"We also discussed the situation as regards our rural roads," he said.

Milton, along with Halton Region, is seeking money to upgrade the roads in the region which the Ministry of Transport have found to be the worst in Ontario.




