# Town highlights for 1986

Town Administrator Roy Main listed the accomplishments of Milton Council and its administration for 1986 at a recent meeting. The extensive list, in no particular order, follows:

Meetings: Town Council met 28 times last year in council and 15 more as a general committee. Councillors considered 495 staff reports, which represented more than a 20-per-cent increase over 1985.

Bylaws: During 1986, Council enacted 96 bylaws, an increase of 15 over the previous year. Among the significant pieces of legislation were:

 Adoption of a town-wide emergency plan

 Authorization of \$100,000 for tile drainage applications;

the first phase in 1987; Authorization and funding for an ice re-surfacer for Memorial Arena;

Acquisition of a Champion grader

(replacement/upgrade); A four-wheel drive multi-purpose

· The addition of five portable radios for the fire department. New Programs or Facilities: The major ones are:

· The lighting of the second ball park at Drumquin Park;

The new ball park and clubhouse

at Campbellville: · Resurfacing the courts at Nassagaweya Tennis Club:

. Hiring C.A. Ventin Architects for the preparation of design and specifications for the Town's Meeting

· Hiring a landscape architect for the preparation of the ultimate design drawings for Victoria Park:

· Installing energy-efficient programs at Memorial Arena.

The design, acceptance and plan-

ting of the Town Hall Courtyard through the assistance of the Milton Horticultural Society.

Major Events: Among the events which involved the Town's assistance

 The hosting and co-sponsorship of a volunteer reception for volunteer groups in town;

· The sponsorship and participation in a local government Open House; and

. The assistance to a major film production at Victoria Park titled I'll Take Manhattan. Looking Ahead: Among the

development projects begun last year and expected to be completed this year are:

· Magna International, which is expected to be occupied before June;

· The addition of several major industrial clients, including Northern Telecom, Kinney Shoes, Canadian Building Products' which total more than 300,000 square feet of industrial-

 The construction of new facilities for Milton Chrysler Dodge; and

 Construction of more than 50 estate residential properties. throughout the town.


