## Banner year nets hospital foundation \$130,000

Last year was a banner year for Milton District Hospital in terms of the amount of dollars raised by the

community and the opening of the new and old wings.

"It was one of our best years yet," said Shelagh Conway, president of the MDH Foundation at the eighth annual meeting on Wednesday evening.

"Thanks to the generosity and support of the community, the foundation raised more than \$130,000 for the hospital."

In addition to the official opening of the expanded hospital in October, the year produced a record income of \$205,252 for the updating and modernization of hospital facilities and equipment.

Major fund-raising endeavours for the year included Bruce Hood's Milton Travel Jamaica Night, The Champion's annual charity golf tournament, Woodland Fantasy Dinner Auction, and the Jail and Bail Campaign.

The Jail and Bail Campaign, organized by the foundation, held in November, which saw local residents thrown in mock jail cells for the weekend, raised more than \$20,000 for the hospital.

Woodland Fantasy Dinner and Auction Night, also organized by the foundation in September, netted more than \$19,000, while Jamaica Night and The Champion's golf tournament raised more than \$20,000.

The foundation's target is to raise a minimum of \$100,000 a year for hospital equipment and upgrading of the facilities.

Mrs. Conway said the official opening of the hospital should mark "the beginning of a new decade of fund-raising to help keep the hospital up to date, and enhance and

Our work as the fund-raising arm of the hospital must be continued as vigorously as in the past."

The foundation prepared two informative brochures last year. One pointed out the tax benefits of making bequests in the form of life insurance polices with the foundation as the beneficiary, the second was information on the foundation.

Three foundation members served six-year terms and are resigning. Stepping down are Mike Ledwith, Matt Jaecklein, and Ken Newell. A fourth member, Bob van Es, is stepping down after one year on the foundation.

Three local citizens, Rod Lewis, Bob (Pie) Lee, Garth Smith were nominated to serve three-year terms on the foundation. Jim Powers was nominated for a two-year term.

Other directors remaining on the foundation are Shelagh Conway, Jim Dills, Anne Ptolemy, Murray


Wilson, Richard Furlong and appointees Barbara Richardson for the hospital auxiliary, Dr. W.S. Legate
