

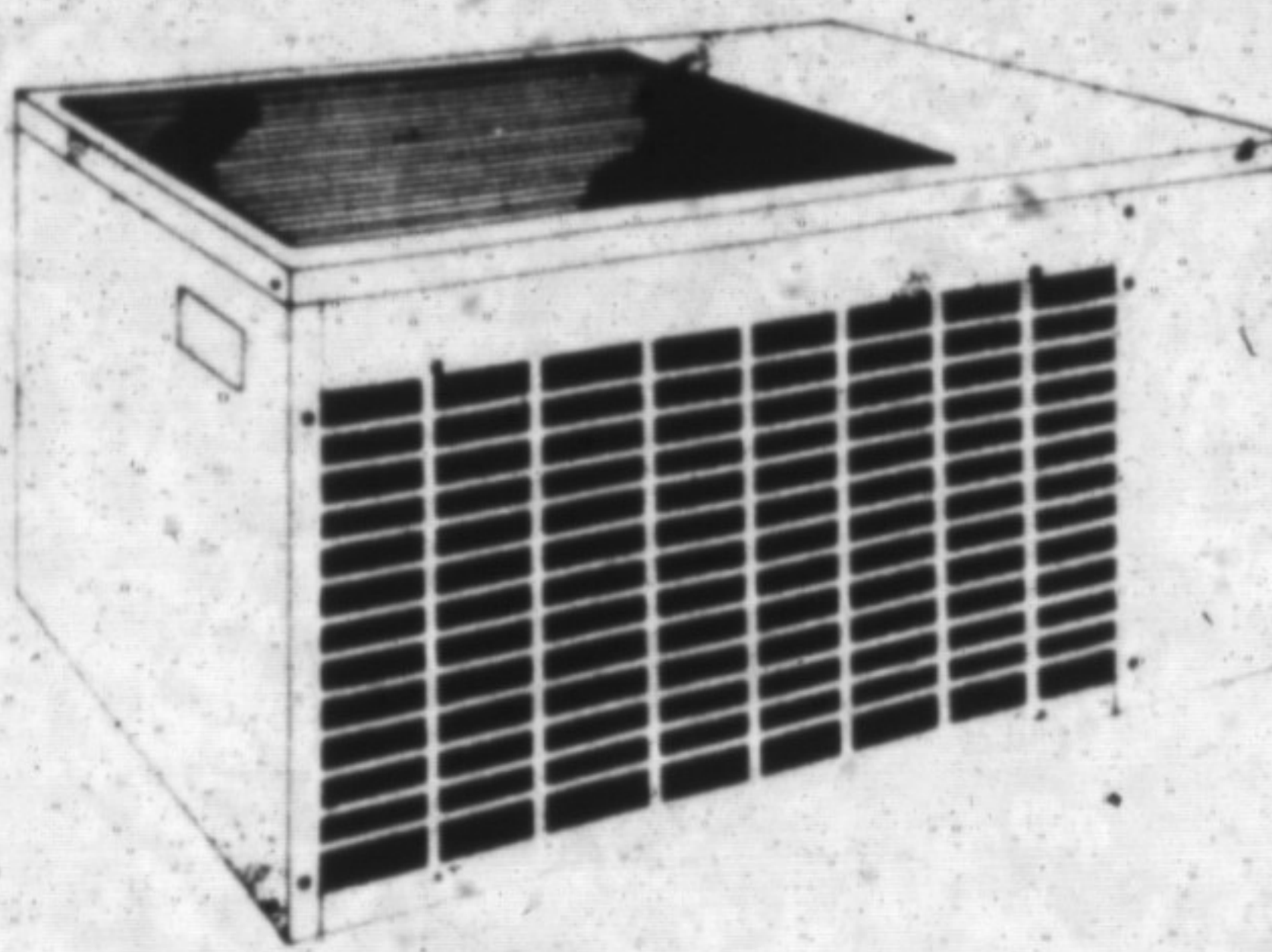

REPLACEMENT OF HIGHWAY 401 OVERPASS AND RECONSTRUCTION AND WIDENING OF STEELES AVENUE, THOMPSON ROAD TO FOURTH LINE, TOWN OF MILTON

NOTICE OF COMPLETION OF ENVIRONMENTAL STUDY REPORT
MARCH 2, 1988

As a requirement under Ontario's **Environmental Assessment Act**, the Regional Municipality of Halton hereby notifies all interested individuals and parties that the Environmental Study Report (ESR) for the above mentioned project has been completed. Subject to the comments received as a result of this Notice and the receipt of other approvals as necessary, the Regional Municipality of Halton intends to proceed with the construction of the above mentioned project.

The purpose of the replacement of Highway 401 Overpass and Reconstruction and Widening of Steeles Avenue, Thompson Road to Fourth Line is to alleviate the existing and future traffic capacity deficiency on Steeles Avenue. The total project cost estimate is \$2.72 million and the anticipated construction year is 1990. Detouring of Steeles Avenue traffic will be required for the duration of construction. The ESR will be available for review and public comment at the following location and times:

Interested individuals and parties have 30 calendar days from the date of this Notice to comment on the proposal. Comments must be made in writing and must be received by the Municipal Office by 4:30 p.m. on April 5, 1988.

If concerns regarding this project cannot be resolved, a person/party may request that the Minister of the Environment "bump-up" this project to an individual environmental assessment. Bump-up requests must be submitted to the address below. If there are no concerns expressed by the above date, the replacement of Highway 401 Overpass and Reconstruction and Widening will proceed as presented in the ESR.

Goal is \$62,500

Canvassers raise bulk of cancer society funds

Organizers of the Milton chapter of the Canadian Cancer Society are gearing up for the 1988 fundraising effort set to get into full swing after Easter.

April is officially designated the Cancer Society's campaign month. This year's target is \$62,500. Last year's goal was \$55,000, but solid efforts by canvassers and other volunteers pushed the total to \$72,000.

"The bulk of our fundraising comes from canvassers," said Carol Kerr campaign chairperson. "Last

year our door-to-door canvassing raised \$65,000."

In the past the Cancer Society has had between 375 and 400 canvassers covering both urban and rural Milton. A meeting has already been set to distribute canvassing kits for Tuesday Mar. 8, at 7:30 p.m. at Robert Newman Shoes.

Mrs. Kerr says that additional canvassers are always needed and those interested in volunteering should contact the Society at 878-5228, or herself at 878-2959.

Another big fundraiser in the past has been the Night at Mohawk Raceway which has been offered for three years. Mrs. Kerr says there will likely be a repeat of the event this year, probably in early May.

The annual sale of daffodils by the women of Beta Sigma Phi Sorority has also contributed to the success of past campaigns. Pre-orders for the flowers that will come from Vancouver have been taken, as local businesses have already been contacted.

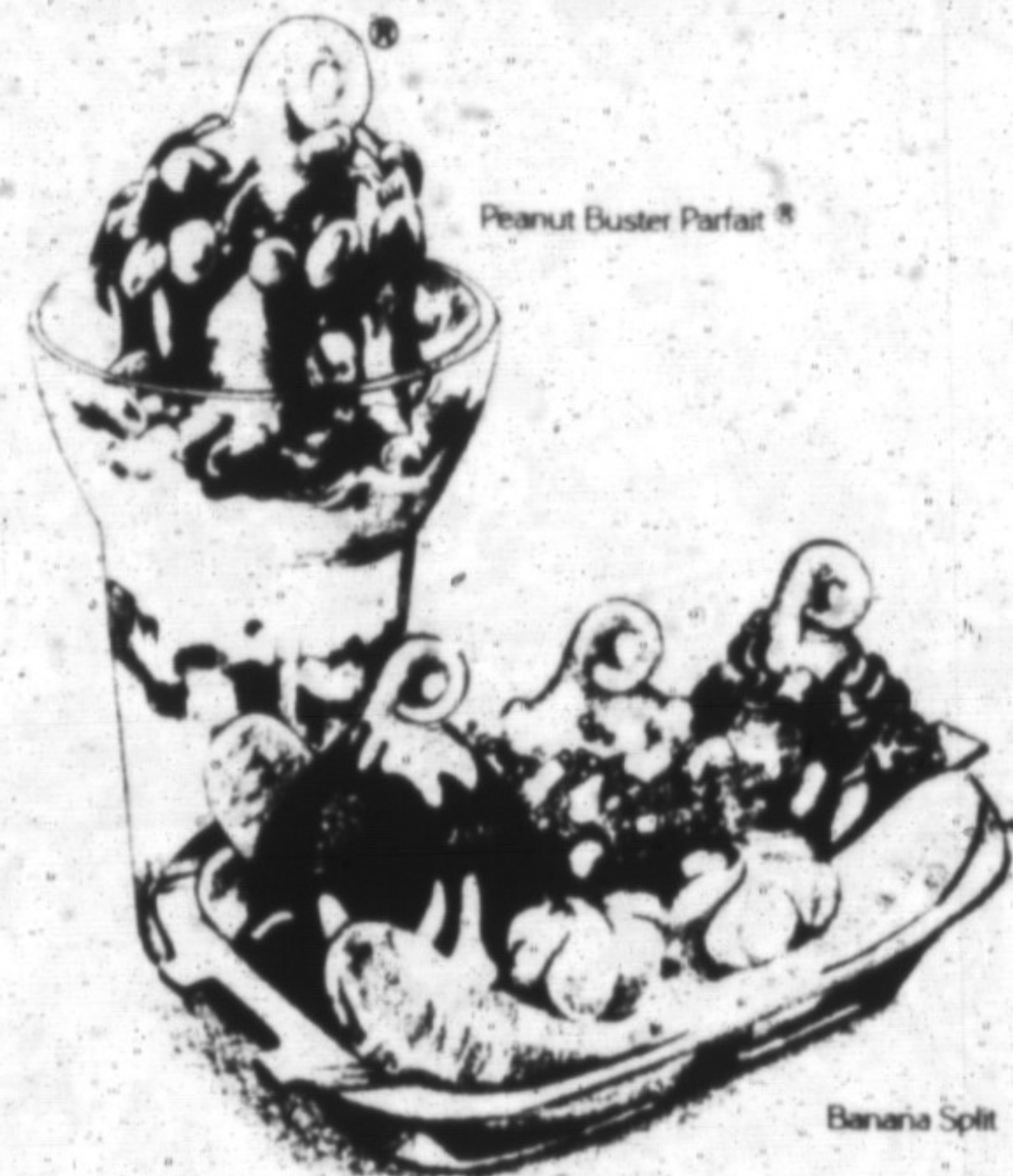
The flowers will be available in Milton Mall in the early part of April.
