Man is charged after stolen items found

A 19-year-old Commercial Street man has been charged with three counts of possession of stolen property as a result of an investigation.

The man was charged on Friday after police discovered two videotapes stolen from Videoflicks on March 9, a VCR stolen from a residence on Wednesday, and \$600 worth of glass figurines stolen from Birks in Toronto.

He will appear in provincial court on April 11.

SUSPECT WANTED

Police have issued a warrant for a 16-year-old Guelph Line female for being involved in the theft of \$9,000 worth of jewelry from a residence.

A small amount of jewelry was recovered.

The youth has left the area, hence the warrant.

ASSAULT

A 16-year-old male resident of Greenmount Youth Home on Graham Bell Ct. has been charged with two counts of assault following an incident Sunday evening.

Police said two staff members approached the youth in his room around 11 p.m. and told him the noise was disturbing the peace. He is alleged to have struck both workers.

BREAK AND ENTER

Police have good descriptions of five youths wanted in connection with a break and enter into a Childs Drive residence Monday morning.

The home was entered through a basement window. An indeterminate amount of coins, liquor and cigarettes were stolen. The incident took place between 10 a.m. and 11 a.m.

All five youths are described as being male, in the 15-18 age range.

One has shoulder-length blond hair and was wearing a bright red waist-length jacket.

Another has shoulder-length black hair and was seen wearing a black, zippered jacket.

The third has light-coloured hair and was wearing an acid-washed jean jacket.
