

Heritage etched in wood by local artist

The historic train station which houses the Milton Chamber of Commerce offices has been portrayed in a wood carving by local artist Kim Murray.

The original carving was unveiled Sunday afternoon at the home of Tom and Cinda Richardson. The open house was held in conjunction with Mrs. Richardson's Campbellville art gallery Wishes, where reproductions will be sold.

Up to 495 limited-edition reproductions will be available at \$225 each until May 1. After that date the price goes up to \$245. After the carving was unveiled Sunday, nine copies were sold.

"It's a distinctive art form and the station links Milton with its heritage," said chamber administrator John Lawrence of the carving.

The commissioned piece was the idea of chamber executive member Bob Lawrence. The reproductions are intended for personal collections but the chamber administrator said they are also excellent gifts for valued customers.

Visitors to the open house also had a chance to meet artist Ken Newby whose work is featured at Mrs. Richardson's gallery.

The framed carvings of the old train station are available at several

locations in town, in addition to Wishes in Campbellville. The chamber office, Delacourts, St. Clair Paint and Wallpaper, and the Harrop Restaurant are other outlets where the carvings can be ordered.

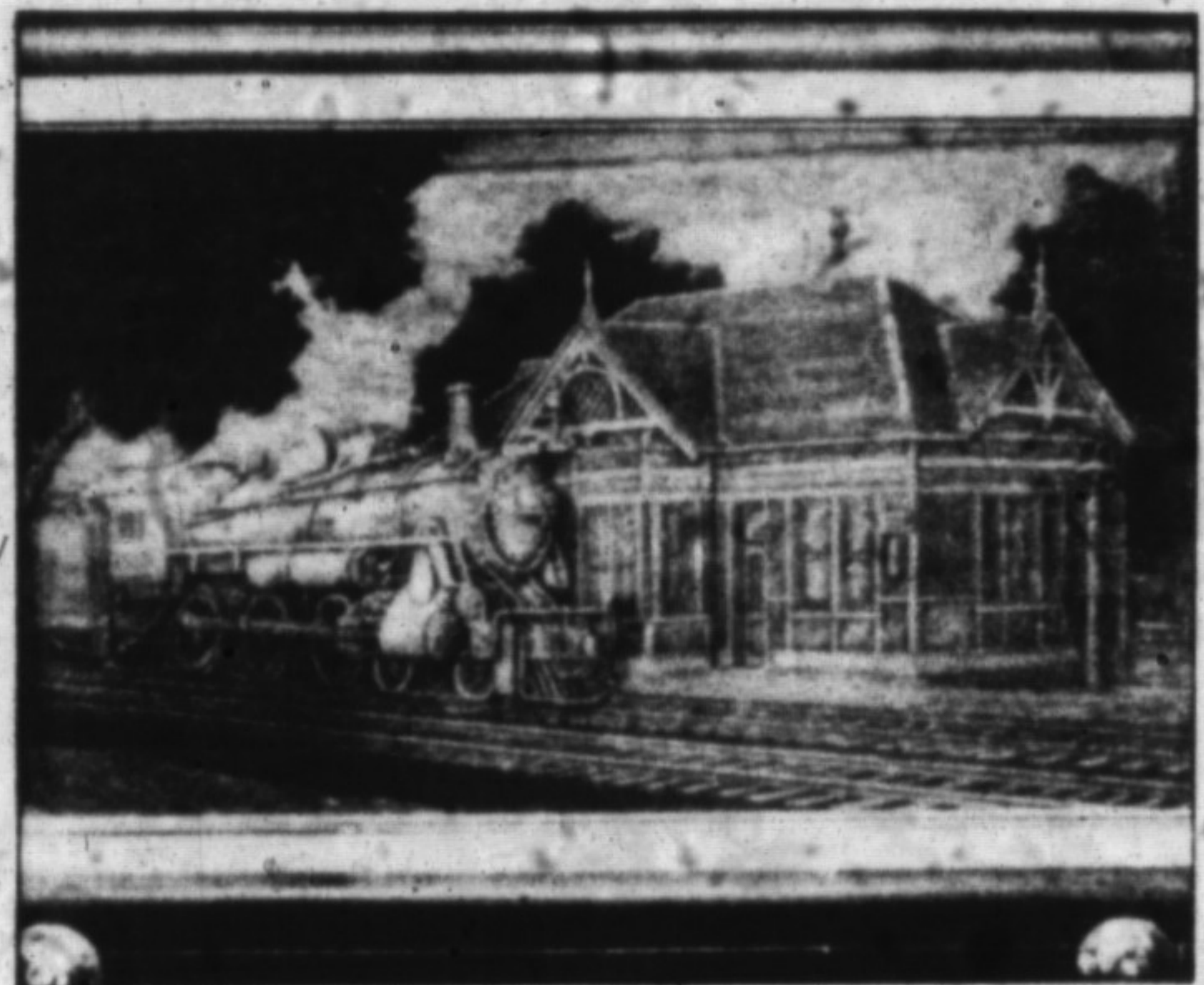
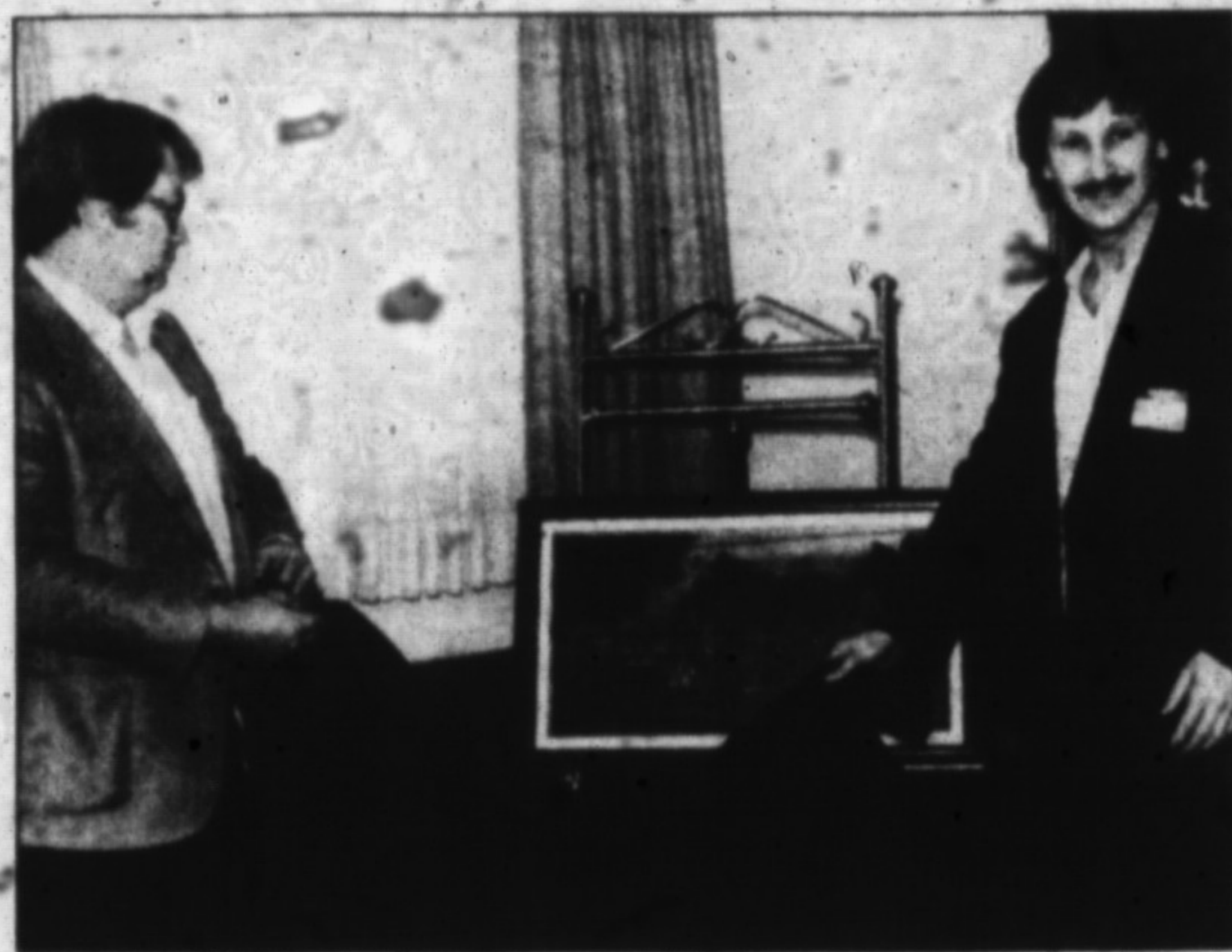
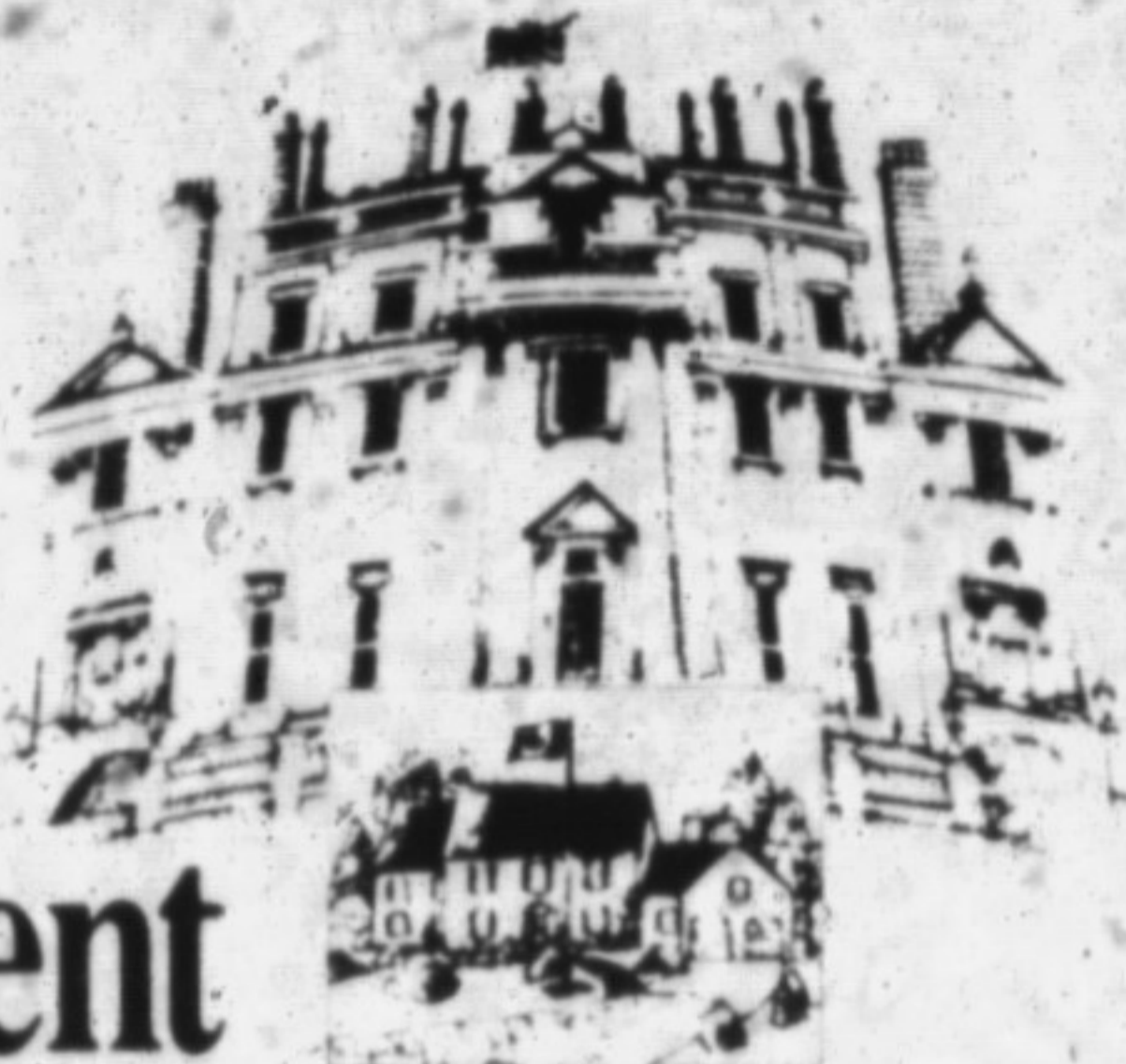
