

Kelly New pavilion dedicated to man with sense of humor

Long a friend of the outdoors, former Oakville councillor Ryland J. (Kelly) New was remembered Saturday when a new picnic pavilion at Mountsberg Wildlife. Centre was named after him.

The special ceremony attracted a who's who of politicians and friends of Mr. New, who died last year. He'd served for many years on Oakville council and had completed 16 years of service to the Halton Region Conservation Authority when he died.

The master of ceremonies was Bill Walker, a national radio and TV personality. In addition, Halton MP Otto Jelinek, Halton Region chairman Peter Pomeroy, Milton councillor and HRCA member Brian Penman and Mr. New's family sat in a special section. More than 100 people attended the ground- breaking ceremony.

Mr. Penman and Mrs. Laure New conducted the unusual ground-breaking ceremony which required two horses pulling a deep shovel.

Mr. New was a member of a fund-raising committee for another purpose at the time of his death. The rest of the committee and Mr. New's friends decided to raise additional funds for a memorial to Mr. New. As a result was decided to become involved with the TRCA. because of Mr. New's association with it.

At the ceremony on Saturday, many of the speakers remarked at Mr. New's good humour and love of life, some even calling him a much-needed eccentric to the humdrum of normal life.

"I was happy to be included as part of the day," explained Mr. Penman. "The day was so up tempo, in keeping with Kelly New and his approach to life. He was very special to a lot of people.

The pavilion was already planned by the authority. With the additional money raised for it, the pavilion will be larger and include indoor washrooms.

It will be located near the maple syrup and pancake huts so the thousands of people who visit Mountsberg in the early spring for real maple syrup can have an indoor place to eat their pancakes.

The Lions Club in Georgetown has announced the 22nd annual running of the Crazy Boat Race set for Saturday, Apr. 9.


