The Choristers sang this beautiful music showing us such feelings as peace, despair and joy.

The men's section provided a firm foundation to the choir, while the sopranos' passages were clear and accurate, and the altos' fuller tones gave a wonderful balance to the choir. The acappella passages were beautiful, as was the unison work.

Soloist Lawrence Cotton of Toronto, was a true baritone, his voice suiting the part he had.

Kathleen West of Milton, soprano soloist, had such feeling in her solo. The choir balanced her voice, giving

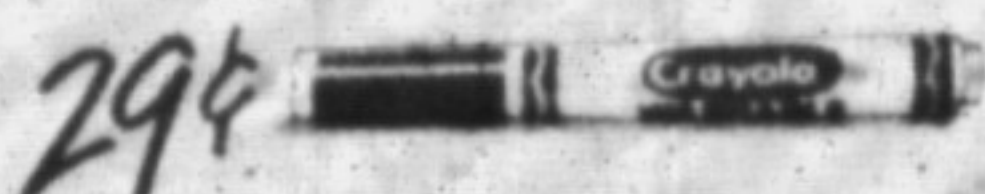
