The hours of operation of the Milton Container Facility at the Regional Operations Centre on Steeles Avenue at Highway 401 are:

8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. — Tuesdays to Saturdays inclusive, all year round. (Closed Sundays, Mondays and Holidays).
