Thomas Lofthouse beat Randy Arsenault in two straight pins to win the gold medal and middleweight division.

Lofthouse is a 1987 camp winner. The two wrestlers met in the round-robin portion of the tournament with Arsenault coming out on top.

Next year the camp will be replaced by the Milton Olympic Wrestling Club. The new club starts activities in January and is open to boys from Grade 5 up to high school.


