Fall fair will feature RCMP musical ride

The famous Royal Canadian Mounted Police Musical Ride will be the featured attraction at this year's Milton Fall Fair.

Fair Board officials announced this week the RCMP riders will perform at the fairgrounds grandstand Friday, Sept. 23 at 7:30 p.m. and again Saturday, Sept. 24 at 2 p.m.

The 135-year-old Milton Fair, the largest rural-urban showcase in this area, runs Sept. 23, 24 and 25. It

features exhibits and competitive events of interest to both rural and urban participants, including livestock shows, horce races, arts and crafts, domestic competitions, fruit and vegetable displays, a woman's theatre program and commercial exhibits. Of interest to the children are the school exhibits, Friday youth day program, a petting zoo, and the midway rides and

The RCMP Ride is performed by 32 horses and riders from RCMP headquarters in Ottawa, who tour Canada, the USA and foreign countries as Canada's "goodwill ambassadors" each summer. The Ride has been a colourful tradition and ceremony since 1887, although the history of the RCMP dates back to 1873 when the North-West Mounted Police force was established in Canada.

Miltonians will have a chance to experience a part of our heritage, by seeing the RCMP Musical Ride at Milton fair this fall.




