The recognition came during Founders Day celebrations at the Muddy Duck. Women of the Year representing each of the five chapters of Beta Sigma Phi Sorority were honoured along with five long-time members who were inducted into the Order of the Rose.

Women of the Year included Mary Knight of Eta Phi; Sandra Deecker of Theta Tau; Louise Bean of Xi Zeta Beta; Janis Coulter and Maureen Stoskopf of Xi Zeta Upsilon; and Patricia Crucefix of Preceptor Gamma Sigma.

Mrs. Knight, a five-year member of Eta Phi was cited for always being willing to help no matter how busy her schedule. Her smile and warm manner were other qualities noted which led to her receiving the Woman of the Year award.

Devotion to her chapter and to her sisters earned Mrs. Deecker the Woman of the Year award for Theta Tau Sorority. She was credited for having her heart in her sorority activities during her four-year membership.

Mrs. Bean's list of accomplishments as a member of Xi Zeta Beta sorority includes co-ordinating the group's scrapbook and program book and taking part in the social, ways and means and service committees. A seven-year member, this Woman of the

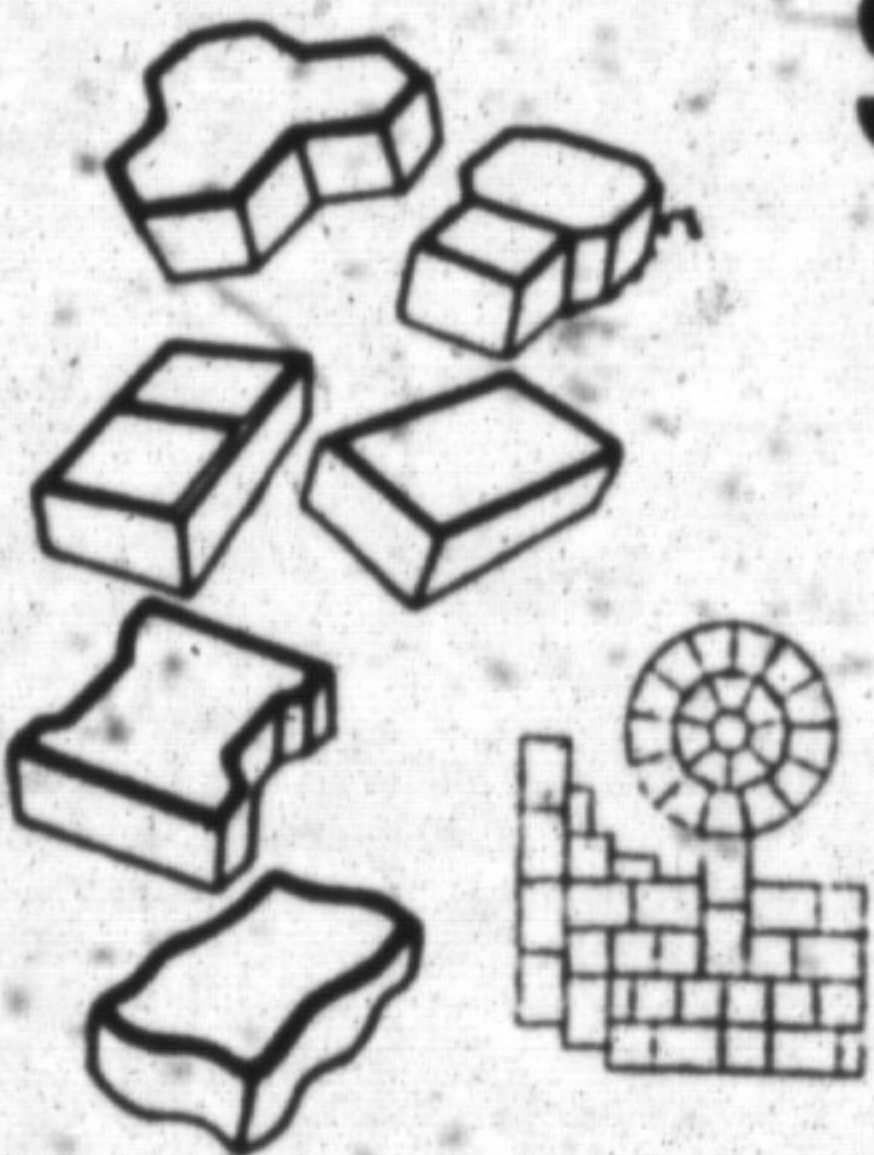
