

Deposit bag missing

A deposit bag full of money and cheques valued at approximately \$3,000 was stolen from a basement office at the Campbellville Opera Emporium on Main St. Sunday.

Police say the incident occurred at approximately 7:50 p.m. The store was open at the time. Culprit(s) entered the basement office and forced open the filing cabinet containing the deposit bag, then left the scene.

Police are still investigating.

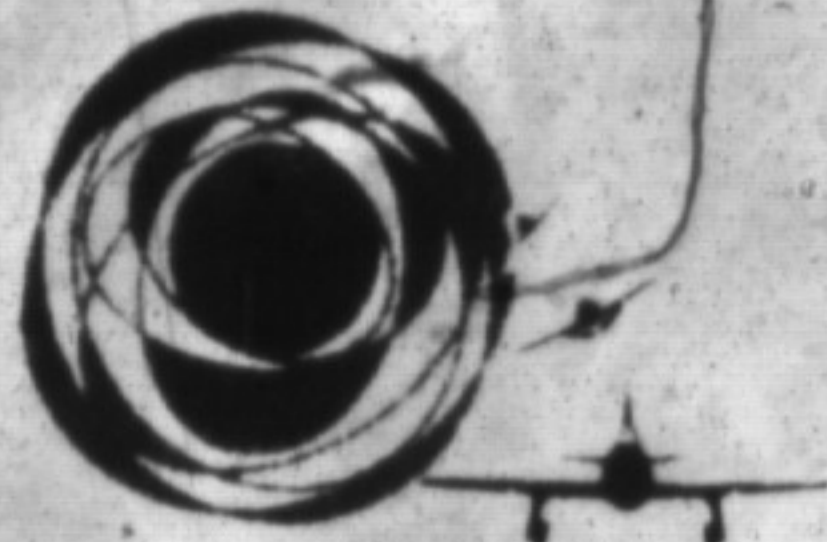
Also planned is a 50-50 draw, other prizes donated by Campbellville merchants, and an honorary village mayor will be named.
