Bruce McKerr, formerly of Milton, died suddenly on Thursday May 5 at City Hospital, Saskatoon, Sask. He had resided at Saskatoon for the past five years.

Bruce is survived by his wife Eleanor, daughters Joy, of Vancouver; and Lynn (Bill) Gee, and grandsons Loren and Brennen of Saskatoon. Cremation and interment at Hillcrest Memorial Gardens on Tuesday, May 10.

Mary Feaver, a Guider in Timberlea District, died May 4 after a lengthy battle with cancer.

Mrs. Feaver, 43, was born in St. Agatha, near Kitchener. In 1961, she left school after Grade 10 to work on her parents' farm. She was active in the local 4-H club. In 1966, she began working at Colonial Cookies in Kitchener.

She married Eldon Feaver in 1971 and lived on campus at the University of Waterloo for six years while her husband attended university.

In 1977, the Feavers moved to Milton. Mrs. Feaver left her position with Colonial Cookies to pursue a family and work with the community in a variety of volunteer positions.

Mrs. Feaver was a Beaver leader in 3rd Milton Pack during 1978 and 1979. From 1982 to 1985, Mrs. Feaver coached many baseball teams. They were Barb's Beauty Salon (junior T-ball) and Mike's Barber Shop (intermediate) in Milton Minor Baseball; Diet Centre in 1984 in girls' T-ball; and Rotary Club in 1985 in Milton Girls' Softball.

Many young boys and girls enjoyed Mrs. Feaver as a coach for her understanding and dedication to the team.

Mrs. Feaver joined Girl Guides of Canada, Millpark District, in September, 1982. She worked with Sue Green, Gina McClay and Sharon

Fox in 7th Milton Brownie Pack. She helped organized sleepovers, enrollments, fly-up ceremonies, crafts and games.

She moved to the Timberlea area and joined Timberlea District in September, 1985. She worked with Debbie Fournier and Barb Lister.

Mrs. Feaver went to Camp WYOKA, White Oaks Area Camp, July 4-11 last year.

She was dedicated to Guiding. Even though she was very ill, she continued to show a great interest in the Guiding movement.

Mrs. Feaver received her Long Service Certificate on Sept. 22, 1987.

"Mary was a sister to all Guiders," said Marilyn Rutland, Timberlea district commissioner, "and she will be remembered for her wonderful smile, her cheerfulness and her kindness to the girls."

Mary Feaver (nee Detzler) is survived by her husband Eldon, son Scott, daughter Ginger, brothers Michael of Kitchener, Joseph of Wellesley, and Jacob of St. Clements, sisters Cecilia of Roseville, and Eileen of Kitchener, and sister-in-law Diane of Cambridge. She was predeceased by her parents Clarence and Clara.

Funeral mass for Mrs. Feaver was held from Holy Rosary Church on May 10.
