Playoff hopes slim for seniors

Now this is optimism. Bert Vella, coach of the Milton Mustangs junior soccer team, thinks he will have a strong junior squad next season despite the team's woeful 0-5 record this year.

Maybe it's because of the team's winless season they will be better. "We've got a lot of young kids on the team this year," said Vella. "We're only losing three players. This means that next year all of the Grade 9s will be another year older and bigger and stronger."

Vella will take all the improvement he can get. The Mustangs played last Thursday and dropped another close, low-scoring game, 2-1 to Loyola.

"All of the games have been close. This year we've lost 1-0, 2-1 and 2-0," explained assistant coach Verne O'Neil.

Currently, the junior Mustangs are suffering from a typical Canadian soccer malady, a lack of goal scoring.

"The boys are getting the chances," said Vella. "they just can't seem to put the ball in the net. We're not finishing off our scoring chances."

Milton led Loyola 1-0 on a goal by Kyle Hasselheldt, but couldn't hold the advantage.

"We'll be much stronger next year," predicted Vella.

On the senior side, the Mustangs don't seem to want to taste victory this year. After losing their first two games of the year they then tied three in a row before losing their most recent game of the year, 4-0 to Loyola.

"Even if we win our last game of the year, I don't think it is going to

be enough to make the playoffs," said senior coach Fred Stevens.

Stevens said he switched his coaching strategy halfway through this season.

"We had a successful preseason using a three-platoon system where everybody got roughly the same playing time. We had a large team, about 26 players. After we dropped our first two league games, I decided to go with our best players and it paid off when we got three ties in a row."

Springers win provincial gold

It was first and second for two members of the Milton Springers Gymnastics Club at last weekend's Provincial C Stream Championships held in St. Catharines.

Kim Collier brought home the gold, while Alina King captured silver in a senior competition which featured the top gymnasts from across the province. The girls finished first or second on three of the apparatus.

Collier scored 35.75 points overall. She won the individual golds on the vault, bars and beam, and took silver on the floor.

King copped the gold on the floor and took silver on the vault and beam. Not even a sixth-place finish on the bars could take the silver medal away from her.

Jennifer Anderson, competing with 21 other athletes in the Junior C category, was not to be left out of the Springer domination.

Her 34.93 overall score was good enough for fourth place overall. On the individual events, she won the

silver on the floor and a bronze on the beam.

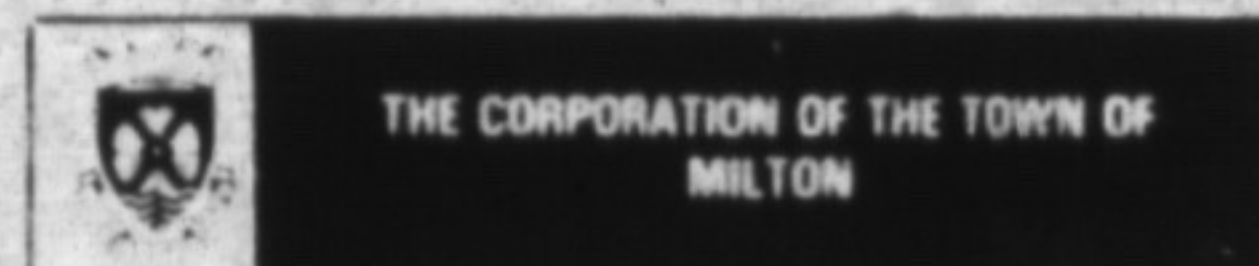
Not to be outdone, the pre-competitive girls met their stiffest competition to date in Oakville and all came home with medals or ribbons.

In Cadet B, Tarah Graham led the way finishing seventh of 23 girls with a score of 33.70. She finished fourth on the vault and fifth on the bars. Shawna Marques was right behind her teammate with a sixth on the bars and she also took a fifth on the floor.

Heather Pettingill showed the way in the Cadet A division with a silver medal in the all-around competition. On the individual events she won the silver on the floor and bars, bronze on the vault and fifth on the beam.

Amanda Young placed ninth overall and finished fourth on the beam, and sixth on the bars. Joanne McSween was right behind in tenth spot and she finished the day with three fourth-place ribbons on the vault, bars and floor. Kim Durand followed in 11th place earning a bronze on the floor.

COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS

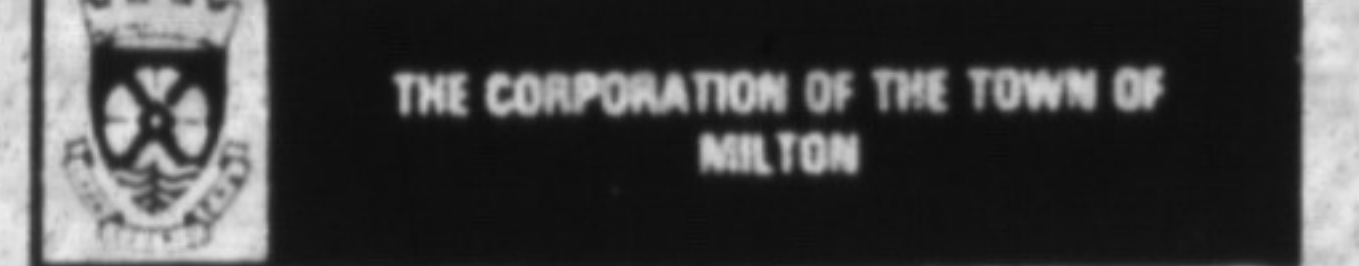
Applications are now being accepted by the Town Administrator for appointment to the Leisure Services Advisory Committee. This Committee will report to the Director of Leisure Services.

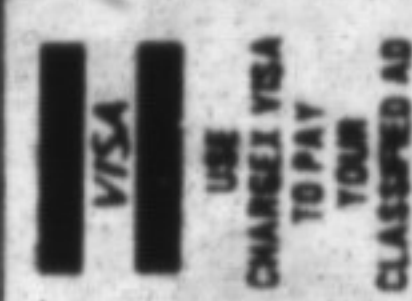
Reason for Proposed Designation:
