### Museum tour concludes season

The final meeting of the John Milton Chapter, IODE, for the summer months was a conducted tour of the Ontario Agricultural Museum on June 23 by the original General Manager, Bob Carbert, now retired.

The McDuffe Farm Machinery Centre Display, a reproduction of the first John Deere Dealership in Canada operated by Richard McDuffe on Main Street in Milton. This historically significant exhibit was of special interest to the group as Mr. McDuffe is an ancestor of one of the IODE members.

We visited the 1830s farmstead,

the Women's Institute Building, the Mayne Corner's Church and the Richmond School. The school was originally built in Nassagaweya Township and was moved to the Museum site and reopened as a Rural Education Centre in May of this year. The Harrop Barn, also on the site was formerly located on Steeles Avenue immediately to the rear of what is now the Harrop House Restaurant.

A noon luncheon was served on the site at the "Cradle and Flail" to the 22 members. Regent Joyce Haines, thanked Mr. Carbert, then held a

short meeting in the Aberfoyle Hall, where everyone had an opportunity to view the sketches of more than 80 outstanding Agriculturalists who have been honoured there.
