## Billets needed for tennis tourney

At the end of July, 66 of the best tennis players under the age of 14 will try to win a national title at the Milton Tennis Club.

For the first time in its history, the local club will host a national junior championship. From July 25-30, the top 32 boys and 24 girls in under-14 will compete in the Chipwich Jr. Nationals.

Local MP and Minister of Supply and Services Otto Jelinek, visited the local club Monday morning to help raise its profile. Mr. Jelinek is the honorary chairman.

For the past several weeks, tennis club members have been busy repainting the clubhouse and prepar-

ing it for the national tournament.

Tournament chairman Tony Schafer said he's pleased with the number of volunteers from the club who are taking part in the tournament.

"The more people you get involved, the more they know how things are run and that helps our tournaments," he said.

However, he acknowledged the club was having problems getting billets for the players. Of the 35 players needing billets, about half have been acquired. Mr. Schafer said anyone in the community interested in billeting a youngster would be compensated with either

Although no player from the Milton Tennis Club qualified for the junior nationals, it's possible some may be asked to fill in should some spots be opened at the last moment.

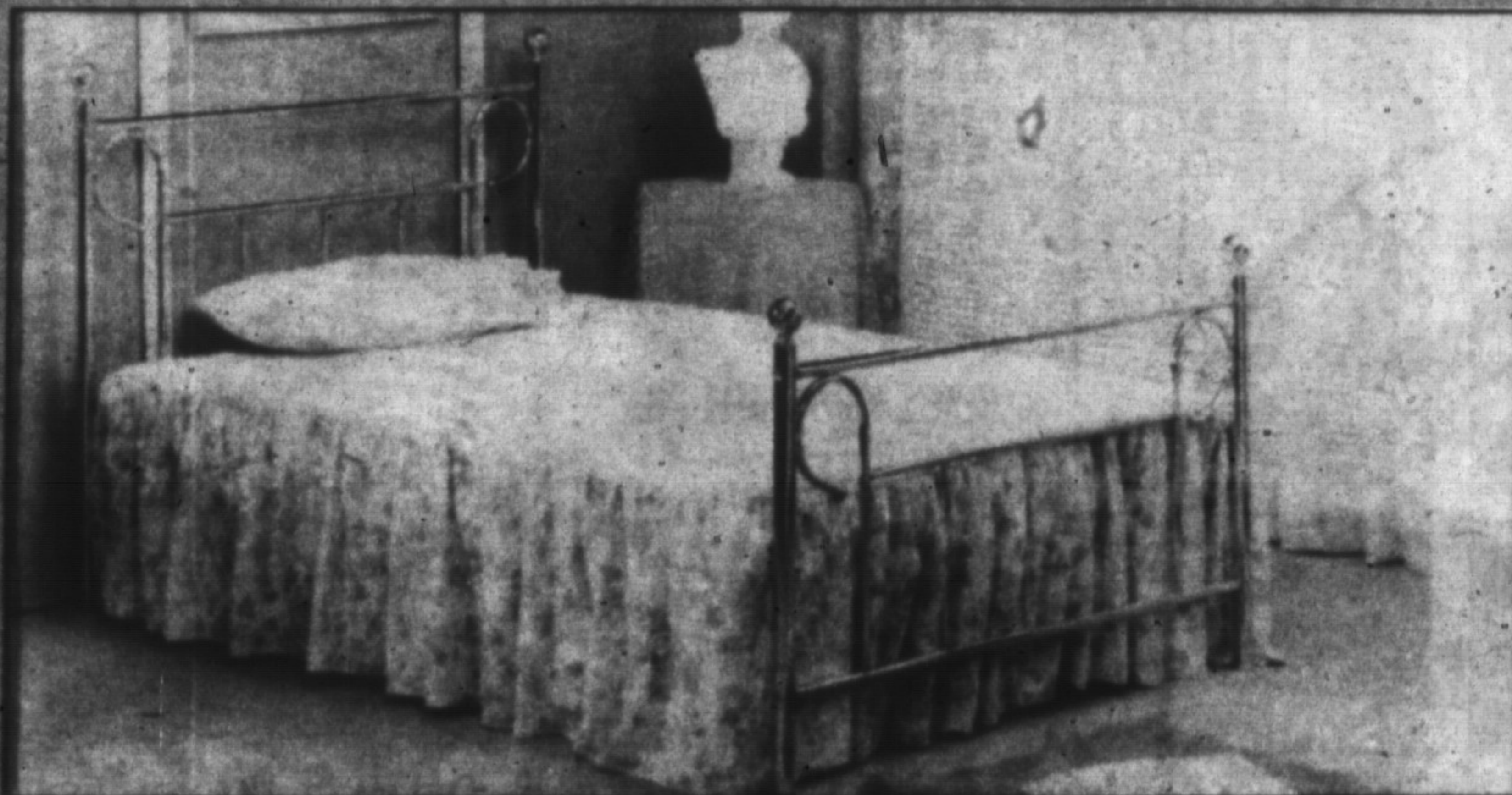
The under-14 championships brings together the best young players in Canada. Previously, juniors were divided into under-12, under-14, under-16 and under-18 but the under-12 was dropped.

The youngest competitor in Milton will be Renata Kolbovic, who'll turn 12 on the last day of the tournament. The nearest competitor is Jason Pun, a 14-year-old from Acton.
