Halton Regional Police have arrested a 15-year-old female of no fixed address and charged her with communication for the purpose of prostitution as the result of several complaints lodged by truckers at the Fifth Wheel Restaurant.

The youth, who police say has been a habitual run-away, will appear in provincial court in Milton on August 19.

RASH OF THEFTS FROM AUTOS

When one is moving in the right direction, financially speaking, Milton's treasury department is loath to set up roadblocks. Especially when they're dealing with charities.

Monday night at municipal council a recommendation was adopted which will allow Milton's service clubs another six months to generate the required provincial revenue to stay in the bingo business.

In conjunction with Diamond Bingo service clubs stage bingos in a hall at the corner of Highway 25 and Five Sideroad. Provincial guidelines call for 20 per cent of the gross revenue to be plowed back into group activities, in essence volunteer work.

That is not the case in Milton yet. Support club revenues range from approximately two per cent to eight per cent, after costs, averaging out at just more than five per cent.

However, town revenue manager Jackie Turbitt told councillors in a report that service club members appear committed to the endeavour. All club members donate their time.

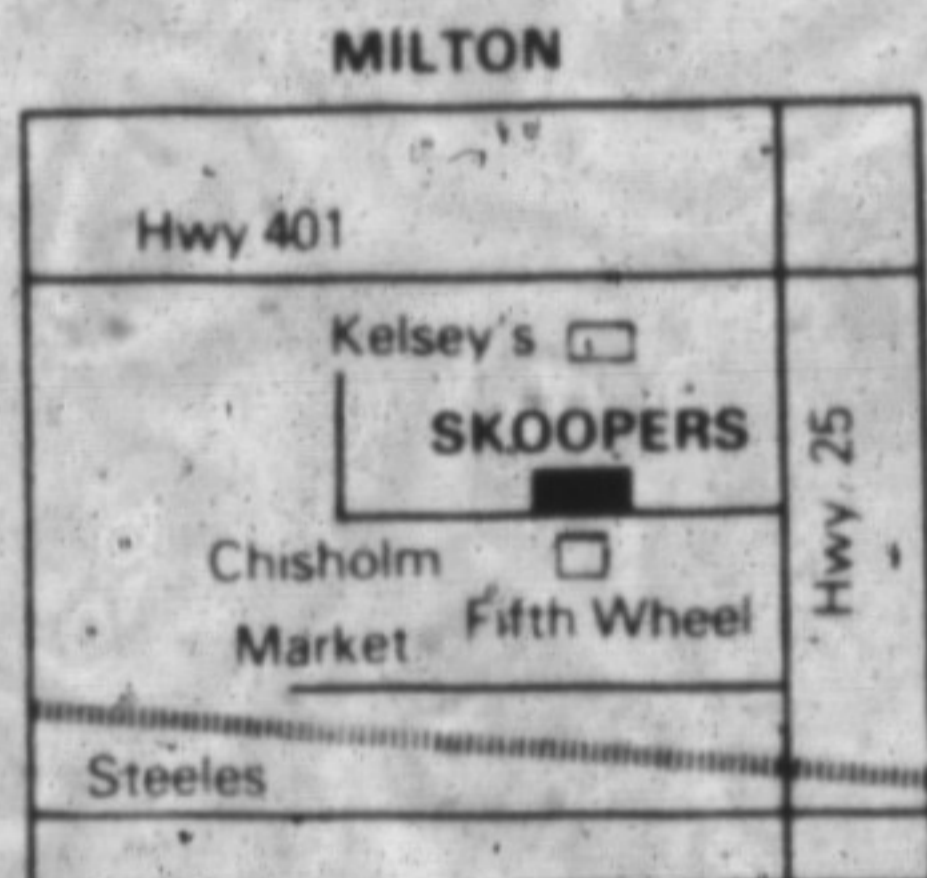
