

Would-be gas station robbers charged

Halton Police have charged an RR 6 Milton youth and a Cambridge man with robbery and weapons dangerous in connection with an attempted robbery at the Essó Gas Bar on Martin St. Friday morning.

The two, one 17 the other 19, were apprehended without incident at a 7-Eleven store on Kerr St. in Oakville shortly after the incident.

Police say two males, one carrying a hunting knife, approached the female night clerk at the gas station and demanded money at approximately 2 a.m. Friday. She refused and the two attempted to enter the booth without success. They then left the scene.

A patrolling officer in Oakville

nabbed the two from a description. Both men were held for a bail hearing on Monday.

ROLL-OVER

Police have charged a 20-year-old Commercial St. man with impaired driving and dangerous driving after he rolled a car while crossing the railway tracks on Bronte St. south of Steeles.

imately 2:10 a.m. Friday. Police say the driver of a 1973 AMC Javelin was travelling northbound on Bronte when he lost control of his car on the tracks.

The vehicle rolled onto its roof. The driver and all three passengers received minor injuries. Injured were: Vince Harview, 21, of Oak St.; Julie Duimstra, 16, of Broadway Ave.; and Kerri Bousfield, 16, of Martin St.

INTERNAL THEFT

Police have charged a 25-year-old Woodward Ave. man with three counts of theft under \$1,000 in connection with three ceiling fans which went missing from Tee-Comm Electronics on Main St.

The accused was employed at the company as a shipper. Police say three shipments of ceiling fans were made to an acquaintance in Kitchener without company permission between July 7-19. The fans are valued at approximately \$1,200.

The man is set to appear in provincial court in Milton later this month.

Police suspect the incident was strike related.

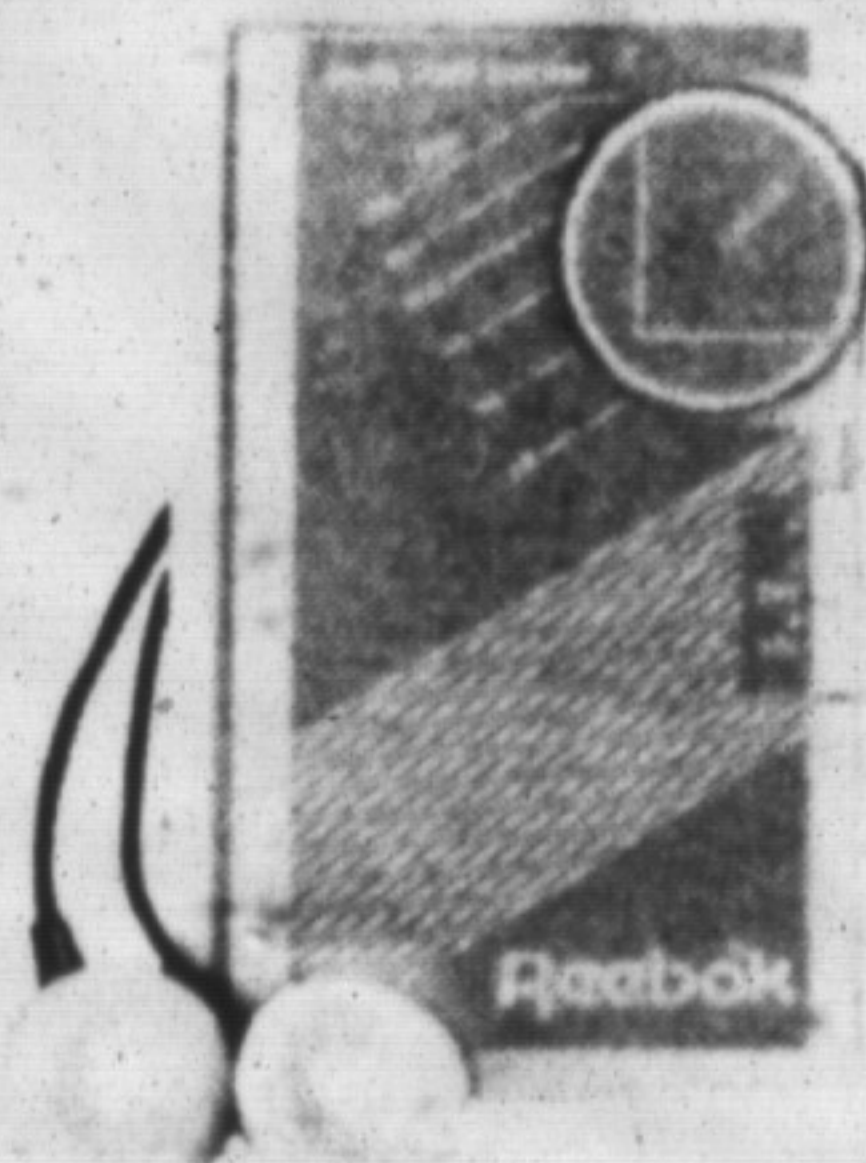
