Library to get new \$172,000 computer

Municipal councillors approved in principle Monday night a resolution which will see the Milton Public Library buy a new computer system, but it's not clear yet how much the province will donate to the cause.

At a total estimated cost of \$172,000, the new system will replace Halinet, an eight-year-old computer network which links Oakville, Milton and Halton Hills.

Instead, Milton will go its own way with an independent computer, considered more cost effective. The province, through a grant, may supply as much as \$70,000 for the replacement. That won't be known until the

grant application is processed.

Halinet will cease operation at the end of 1989. "There will be no computer at all if something does not councillor Brad Clements said.

"There aren't a great deal of op-tions," Mayor Gord Krantz added.

There are 10 area libraries competing for similar provincial grants, chief librarian Jane Watkins told councillors.

The money for the computer includes \$50,000 from the library reserve fund and an anticpated \$52,780 from the 1989 capital budget. The budget is not considered until February at least, and by then town staff expect they will have word from the province regarding how much grant funding will be available.

Dogs dying of poison in Nassagaweya area

Five dogs have died from poison in Nassagaweya over the last month, Oakville Humane Society officials said earlier this week. They warn that animals wandering in rural Milton should be controlled until the current scare is over.

Humane Society officials are at a loss to determine the type of poison or its location, but all the animals have died in the the area bounded by Fourth Line and Fifth Line (eastwest) and Nos. 10 and 15 Sideroads (north-south)

The body of the dog which died most recently has been shipped to the University of Guelph for examination at their veterinary co school.
