The Milton meeting will be held on Wednesday, September 28, 1988 and the topic of discussion is "Noise and Dust".

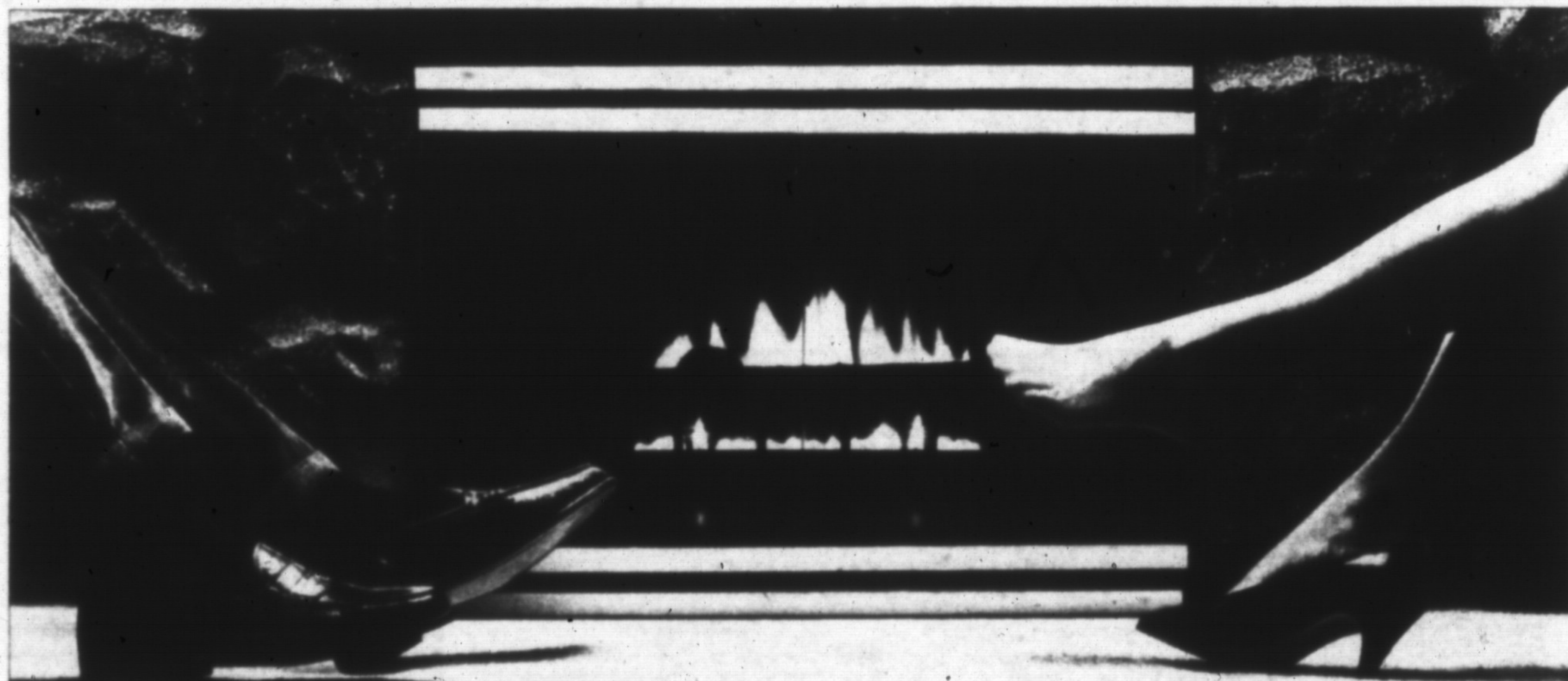
