Dr. Hallett said "minutes are not transcripts," and by far the majority of minutes "have been put out a time vetting for (proofreading)."

The proponents have also produced transcripts when requested, he added.

Campbellville resident Dick Brocklebank said, "I deplore the fact that the record of the discussions (minutes) has taken a long time to come forward." But, he added, "if we stop this process our list of concerns wil not necessarily be completed. "

Bob Masters, a Halton Hills citizen and committee member, said ratepayers had agreed to join in the first place "in the mistaken belief

process." Now, he said, the landfill opponents believe such discussions are "premature."

Dr. Hallett said he did not know when the environmental assessment designation would be forthcoming. although he had been assured by senior government officials that it is forthcoming. It will set the stage for more formal hearings.

Several POWER members and dump opponents said they felt they were tipping their hand in advance to the company by identifying concerns, thus given the proponents an opportunity to form more complete strategy for the hearings.
