Dr. Hallett said "minutes are not transcripts," and by far the majority of minutes "have been put out a long time for vetting (proofreading)."

The proponents have also produced transcripts when requested, he added.

Campbellville resident Dick Brocklebank said, "I deplore the fact that the record of the discussions (minutes) has taken a long time to come forward." But, he added, "if we stop this process our list of concerns will not necessarily be completed."

Bob Masters, a Halton Hills citizen and committee member, said ratepayers had agreed to join in the first place "in the mistaken belief we had to participate in the

process." Now, he said, the landfill opponents believe such discussions are "premature."

Dr. Hallett said he did not know when the environmental assessment designation would be forthcoming, although he had been assured by senior government officials that it is forthcoming. It will set the stage for more formal hearings.

Several POWER members and dump opponents said they felt they were tipping their hand in advance to the company by identifying concerns, thus given the proponents an opportunity to form more complete strategy for the hearings.

Just prior to the adjournment, residents passed a motion stating they would not participate further without government funding at some level to hire their own experts.

Court reporter Dagg retires

Fifty wellwishers attended the retirement of Harold Dagg as a full-time reporter in Halton's district court.

However, Mr. Dagg, 60, has not retired his pens. During a party held last week at the Muddy Duck Restaurant, Mr. Dagg said he will return to the Steeles Avenue courthouse from time-to-time to record, as a freelancer, the proceedings in the small claims court.

Co-workers and friends from Mr. Dagg's past and present told anecdotes about him and his work. The party included many judges, lawyers and members of the cour-

thouse staff. Retired district court judge Alan B. Sprague, who hired Mr. Dagg in 1968, returned to thank him for all his assistance during their early years.

Mr. Dagg began his career in shorthand court reporting in British Columbia in 1966 when the night sittings did not interfere with his day-job as a bookkeeper with a construction company.

Mr. Dagg's retirement is the latest in several from the courthouse staff. Other retirees have included Sadie Thomas, Kitty Boyd, Ariel Mitchell, Olive Burt, Pat Yelnick, and Murray Allen.
