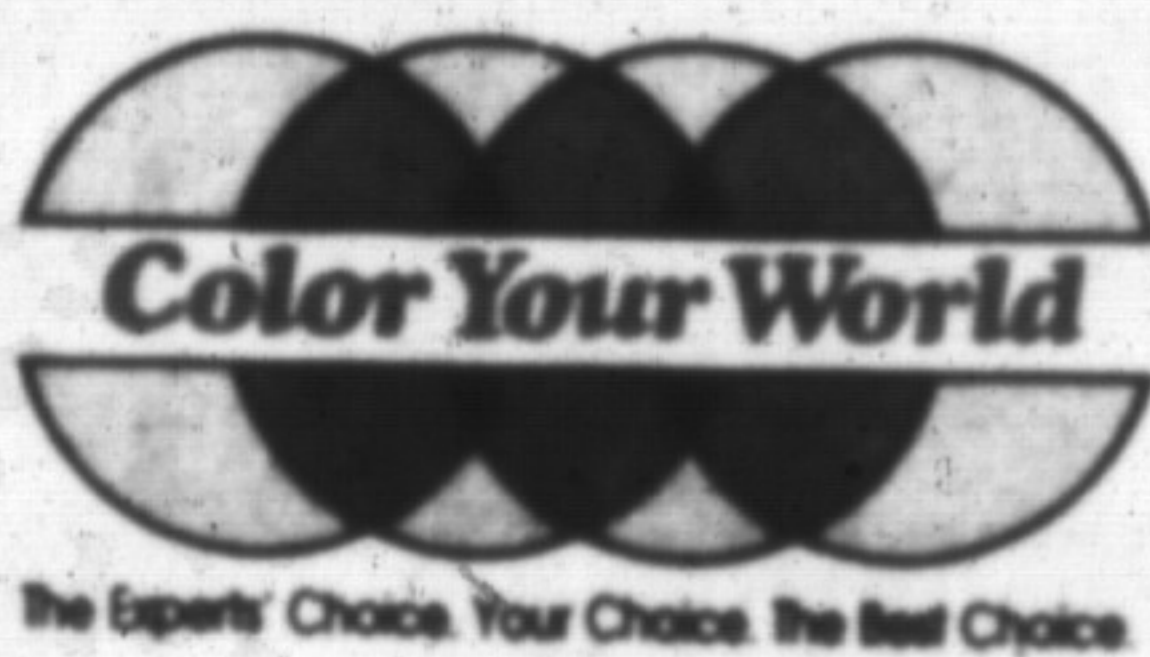

NDP candidate Wolf accuses Tories of disrupting meetings

Battleworn from her previous political entrance into the last provincial election, Fern Wolf is finding federal politics a little dirtier.

Ms Wolf is the NDP candidate in Halton-Peel and she blames several Progressive Conservative supporters with disrupting some of their all-candidates meetings.

What particularly irks Ms Wolf is that Halton-Peel is a new riding without a candidate with previous federal experience. It's anyone's ballgame. As a result, 10 all-candidates meetings have been scheduled over the final two weeks of the federal campaign.

"The Tory supporters have disrupted the meetings and get very rude," she charged. "It's a planned deliberate attempt to heckle and disrupt."

"They attack myself and (Liberal candidate) Pierre Klein. The manner in which they did it was just disruptive. When you have people planted there, then the people who really want to ask the questions don't have a chance. This planned manipulation just doesn't help anyone."

She was referring in particular to a meeting last Thursday night in Burlington. However, PC candidate Garth Turner denied the charges that he planted people to disrupt the meeting.

"It was a good meeting," said Mr. Turner. "The crowd was not happy with some of the answers by the candidates but I didn't plant anyone there. I certainly didn't stack the crowd."

"No, it wasn't out of hand at all. We've had eight all-candidates

meetings and I think it's been extremely civil, really."

Ms Wolf, a Georgetown resident, said she's not discouraged by the polls, which have listed the NDP nationally in third place well behind the neck-and-neck race of the Liberals and the Tories.

"That's what the polls seem to indicate but they've shifted a lot and they'll shift a lot again."

"John Turner's backing down from having the 'fight of his life'. What Canadians want is a firm commitment from their leader."

She said she doubted if John Turner could get a better trade deal with the Americans.

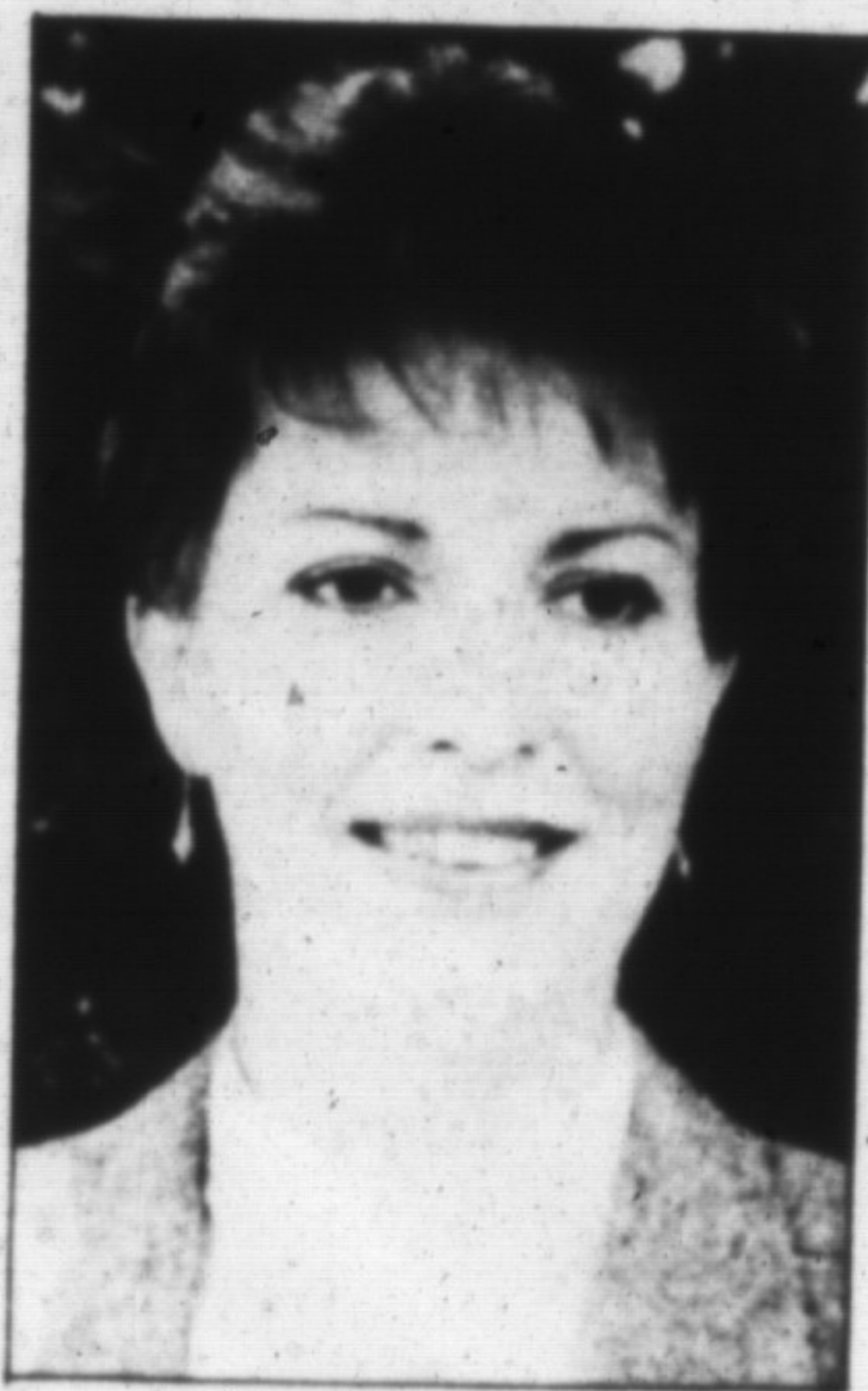
"If the Tories couldn't negotiate a better deal, then John Turner won't."

"(NDP leader) Ed Broadbent's been consistent. Our party's been consistent. At the all-candidates meetings, I usually sit between Garth and Pierre and people see them fighting back and forth."

"They usually ask them how they can come up with the money (for their election promises). Either those parties are lying, or they're going to raise taxes."

She said the environment is a key issue in her riding and the country. She noted a proposal from a private group wanting to use an Acton quarry for a landfill site.

"Government makes decisions based on two powers, money power and people power. The definition of acceptable risk on the environment will depend on where the pressures are coming from."

"My job is to ensure people power applies pressure."

She admits she's at odds with her party's position concerning abortion. A member of the Church of the Latter Day Saints (Mormons) for the past five years, she opposes abortion except where the mother's life is in danger.

"It's a matter of conscience and my party knows where I stand. It's a personal decision."

She acknowledged her experience in the last provincial election has helped her this time.

"The provincial election helped a great deal. It gave me a higher profile. The issues are a great deal the same. The NDP stands up for families and that's where I am."

Ms Wolf has taken a leave of absence from her job to concentrate on the election. However, her union will reimburse her because they are supporting her. She's a four-year member of the party and has attended several provincial and national conventions.

Garage destroyed by fire
