## NDP candidate Wolf accuses Tories of disrupting meetings

Battleworn from her previous political entrance into the last provincial election, Fern Wolf is finding federal politics a little dirtier.

Ms Wolf is the NDP candidate in Halton-Peel and she blames several Progressive Conservative supporters with disrupting some of their all-candidates meetings.

What particularly irks Ms Wolf is that Halton-Peel is a new riding without a candidate with previous federal experience. It's anyone's ballgame. As a result, 10 allcandidates meetings have been scheduled over the final two weeks of the federal campaign.
