

Ski thieves at work

A pair of skis and bindings were stolen from a ski rack on top of a car in the parking lot at Glen Eden Ski Area on Wednesday evening.

The owner of the equipment left the car unattended for 10 minutes, and returned to find more than \$1,000 in skis and bindings missing. The equipment has not been recovered.

WOULD-BE THIEVES

Two males almost got away with a valuable Royal Doulton figurine from Delacourt's on Main St. Wednesday afternoon.

Police say two men entered the shop at approximately 1:40 p.m. While one talked with the sales clerk, the other grabbed the figurine and attempted to hide it under his coat.

The sales clerk noticed the man hiding the figurine and asked him if he wanted to buy it. The man asked how much it was, set it down and then fled.

ASSAULT

An 18-year-old St. Catharines man, currently residing at Maplehurst, is facing an assault charge after he attempted to strike a correctional officer there last Monday.

Police say the man attempted to hit the officer with a pen hidden in an envelope, but was unsuccessful.

The man has been charged with assault with a weapon and is to appear in provincial court in Milton on Dec. 29.

DANGEROUS DRIVER

A 23-year-old Bloomingfield, Ont., man is charged with dangerous driving after he was involved in a single-car accident on Woodward Ave. last Tuesday evening.

The accident occurred at 10:55 p.m.

Police say a vehicle was driving in the area of 271 Woodward Ave. when the driver attempted to pass another vehicle.

The driver lost control of the car

and struck a wall and pole. He left the scene and was later arrested.

The man received minor injuries, and was charged by police at Milton District Hospital.

Total damage to his car, a 1987 Buick, the pole and wall is set at \$15,000.

HOT VEGGIES

Police and Milton Fire Department responded to a truck fire at the intersection of Perry and Trafalgar roads last Monday afternoon.

A fire started in the rear box of a pick-up which was loaded with produce. The fire started when a heater in the box tipped over and ignited boxes.

All \$4,000 worth of produce in box was lost. Total damage estimate to the vehicle and the produce is approximately \$15,000. There were no injuries.

ASSAULT

A Milton woman received several minor injuries last Sunday evening when she was reportedly assaulted by a long-time friend.

Police say the woman was working in the storeroom of the Halton Conference Centre on Sixth Line when her "friend" entered the room and punched her several times.

A 32-year-old Harrop Rd. man is charged with assault causing bodily harm. He is to appear in provincial court in Milton on Jan. 30.

The woman told police she would go to hospital.

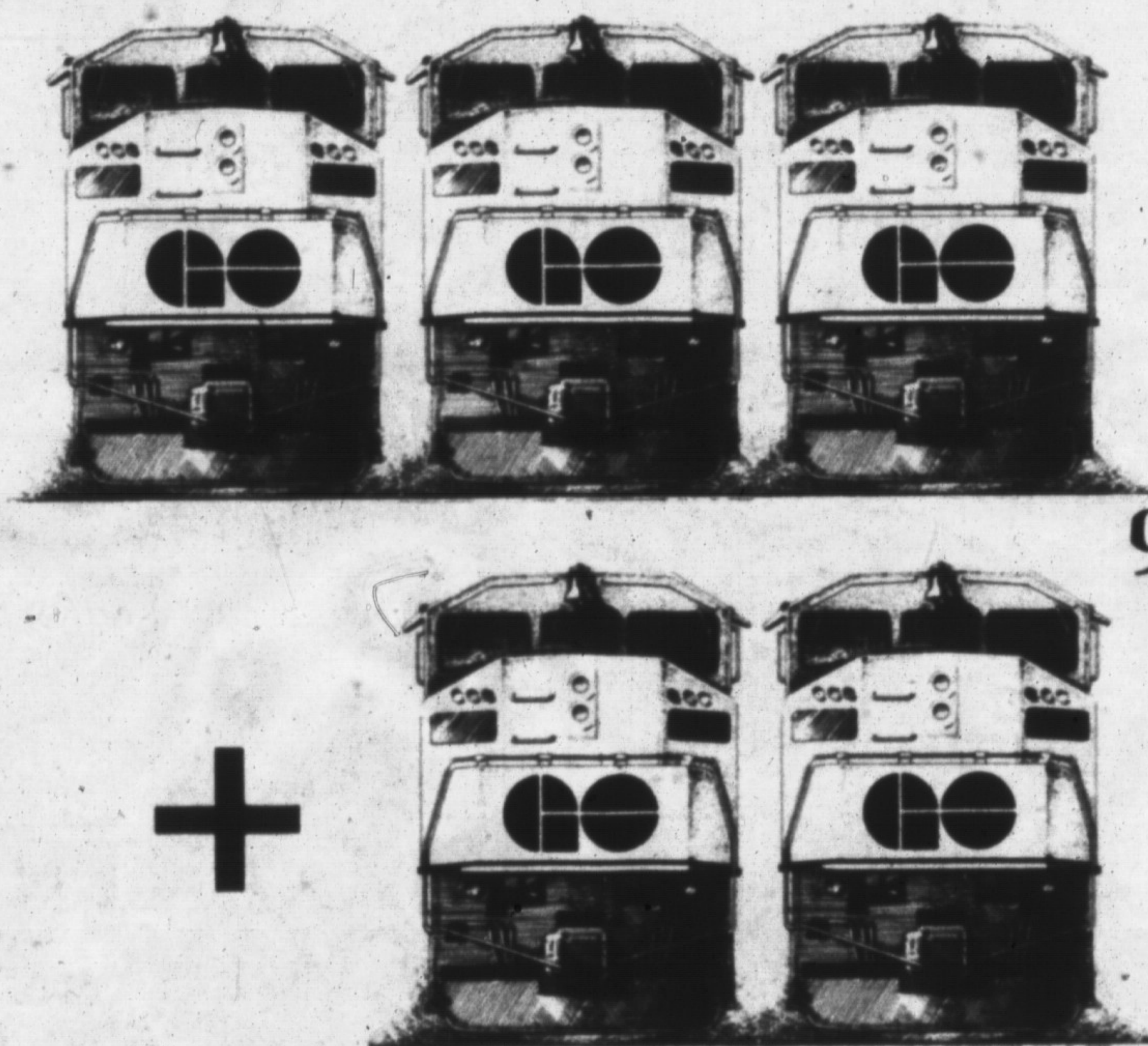
