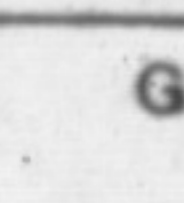

it may take 10 years and \$40 million to get totally new products approved, new formulas involving known commodities can be registered for between \$20,000 and \$40,000.

Julian Wieder, a supervisor of investigation for MOE, said the province requires specific product data

to determine handling precautions and disposal methods for the commodity, should for example, there be a spill or it catches fire.

He acknowledged that the King Pesticides action "is a technical violation."

Mr. Biederman said he had hoped

an informal understanding could be reached on what he called "an oversight" without charges. "To save a whole lot of nonsense and effort. All it's doing is costing the taxpayers money. And it could be a huge embarrassment."

The case goes to court in Milton on Jan. 23.

Keep your distance from fallen wires



Ice storms, high winds, falling tree limbs can bring hydro lines down. Don't go near a fallen wire... even a seemingly dead line can be dangerous. Warn others to keep clear and call (your hydro) to report the fallen wire.

If the line falls across your vehicle, stay inside until the line is removed by a hydro crew.

If you must leave because of fire, jump clear without touching the car and the ground at the same time.

If there's a live power line touching your car, putting even one foot on the ground can be a fatal move to make.
