## Guzman is Victoria bound for x-country championships

It may be a long shot but as they say in golf, no guts, no glory.

Milton's Jennifer Guzman is leaving for Victoria, B.C., tomorrow to attempt to qualify for one of three remaining spots on the Canadian junior women's cross-country team. The team will compete at the world junior cross-country championships in Norway in March.

There are six spots on the team, but three have already been filled thanks to an earlier qualifying meet. The final three spots will go to the first three finishers at the 4,000m race around the University of Victoria campus.

Girls up to the age of 19 will be competing in the race so Guzman, 15, will be at a disadvantage. She has an outside shot of qualifying, said her father Omar Guzman.

"If she runs her very best and a couple of the others who will be at the race don't, Jennifer has a good shot of qualifying for the team," he said. "She's going to have to run like she did at GHAC, where she won the cross-country title by a minute."

Although Guzman is leaving for Victoria tomorrow, the race isn't until Saturday. The course is two kilometres around the university and will be transversed twice. There will also be obstacles on the course such as bales of hay.
