The Town of Milton will host a recreational open house at Milton Mall on Saturday Feb. 25 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Visitors will have an opportunity to stop by displays representing 52 different community, sports and service groups in town.

"It will be much lighter music than the Hamilton Philharmonic," explained Milton Arts Productions member Blanche Hinton.

She explained her group is "trying to appeal to a broad cross-section of the community as we can."

The concerts are slated for Sunday afternoons at Hugh Foster Hall. This is a new venue for Milton Arts Productions. There is some concern the hall will seat only a maximum of 120 and that some potential concert goers will be disappointed.

The advice of organizers is to pur-

chase tickets early as space will be reserved on a first-come, first-served basis.

The March 5 concert will feature Michael Danso, a dynamic singer and dancer who has appeared at Hamilton Place and Toronto's Imperial Room. The internationally-known performer has also worked with the Hamilton Philharmonic Orchestra.

The John Laing Singers will be trying out material they'll be performing at a major choir festival in France later in the year. The choral ensemble will be in Milton April 23.

*Spring Fling* marks the return of the Bowkum Trio. Well received by Miltonians at their first visit, the

three women will this time bring a three-piece back-up band with them. The Bowkuns will provide a grand finale to the concert series on May 28.

Subscription tickets are available for the series at \$35 to adults; \$20 to senior citizens and students. Single tickets can be purchased for individual concerts at a cost of \$15 to adults and \$10 to students and seniors.

Milton Arts Productions will have a booth at the town's Leisure Services Department's annual Open House at Milton Mall, Saturday, Feb. 25. Orders for tickets will be taken at that time. They can also be obtained by sending a cheque

payable to Milton Arts Productions at 234 Garnet St., Milton, L9T 1E8.

Volunteers committed to bringing events like *Spring Fling* to Milton are being sought by Milton Arts Productions. Long-range plans are now being made in light of the Recreational Needs Study released last week which indicated a \$4.4-million cultural centre should be built here.

"The need for involvement and commitment is now particularly great because it's on paper that we're getting a facility," Mrs. Hinton explained.
