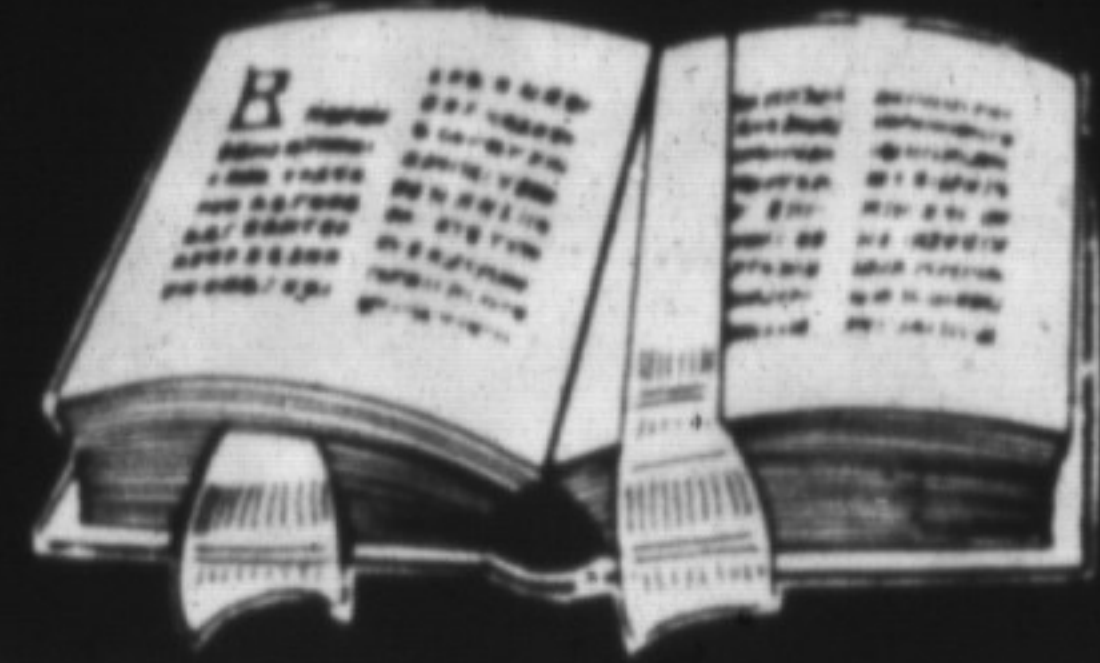

Floral logos coming to Milton?

Almost everyone has a corporate logo, but not too many companies have one made out of flowers.

That was the idea presented to Milton council's general committee Monday night by Gerry Mahoney of Hillside Communications, a company that specializes in floral art arrangements contoured to portray an advertising message.

The company has a contract along a bank of Toronto's Gardiner Expressway, which they expect to complete over the next two years.

Hillside Communications proposes to obtain Milton corporate sponsorships and adorn the embankments beside the CN railway bridge on Highway 25 coming south from Highway 401 with flower displays.

Councillors voted to have staff pursue the idea further with the company.

There is no municipal expenditure involved beyond devoting some time, Mr. Mahoney told councillors. A deal is struck with the corporate clients, and Hillside is responsible for the upkeep of the site. The company has landscape maintenance agreements with CN, which controls the embankment lands.

Mr. Mahoney proposes to alter the right sides on the southbound and northbound embankments.

Councillor Bruce Attenborough was against the idea, saying "it seems to me the public is bombarded with advertising." He spoke of the multitude of roadside signs when one, for example, drives to Florida. "I don't think that's the type of atmosphere we want to create in Milton." Floral logos for "Minolta and Sony ain't my idea of attractive."

Councillor Les Laughren said the idea "definitely deserves a further look." However, Dr. Laughren cautioned that he had "some difficulty" with the low-rise billboards proposed along with the floral display.

tendered following further investigation.

Town of Milton employee Darlene Davidson was given the municipality's outstanding worker of the year award Monday night.

Municipal department heads chose Mrs. Davidson from a list of six employees. Department heads are not allowed to vote for people in their own areas of responsibility "which gives you an idea" of the esteem Mrs. Davidson's work has earned, said Milton mayor Gord Krantz.

Mrs. Davidson's award is the Worker's in Service Excellence (WISE) recognition as employee of the year. She received an honorarium from the municipality and the traditional t-shirt with a hand imprinted on the back, a 'pat on the back.'

Among Mrs. Davidson's other accomplishments, two for which she was cited were her work on the opening of the Hugh Foster Hall, and her handling of scheduling for a Milton 'tour by European journalists.

Milton is joining the PAL program.

The Public Alert, or PAL program, was conceived by Union Gas. It involves using municipal and utility workers to act as a sort of mobile "neighbourhood watch" service, reporting suspicious activity and emergencies on their truck radios.

Halton regional police sergeant Dave Gwilliams and Max Fantuz, Union Gas operations manager for Halton, were on hand to explain the concept to councillors.

The program has already been

endorsed by Halton region.

With Milton's approval, town trucks will now carry the PAL logo. Police will educate school children about program particulars, so they will know that they can go for help to vehicles bearing the PAL logo.

Daring thief

Halton Regional Police are asking for public assistance in providing clues to a break, enter and theft which occurred in Oakville on Jan. 19.

The incident occurred in the early morning hours. An elderly female resident was alone in her home in the area of Upper Middle Road and Ninth Line when she was confronted by a male who had forced entry into her home.

He demanded food and cash, took the woman's cane while he rifled a large sum of money from her purse.
