the brand new, and long-awaited, gymnasium.

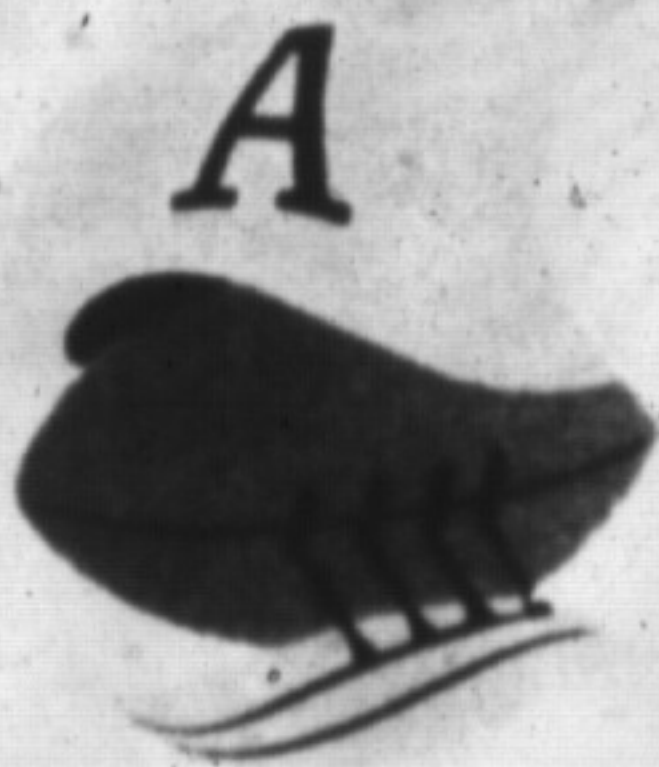
It is all part of the opening ceremonies being held Tuesday which will culminate in a midget/junior boys basketball doubleheader against Acton.

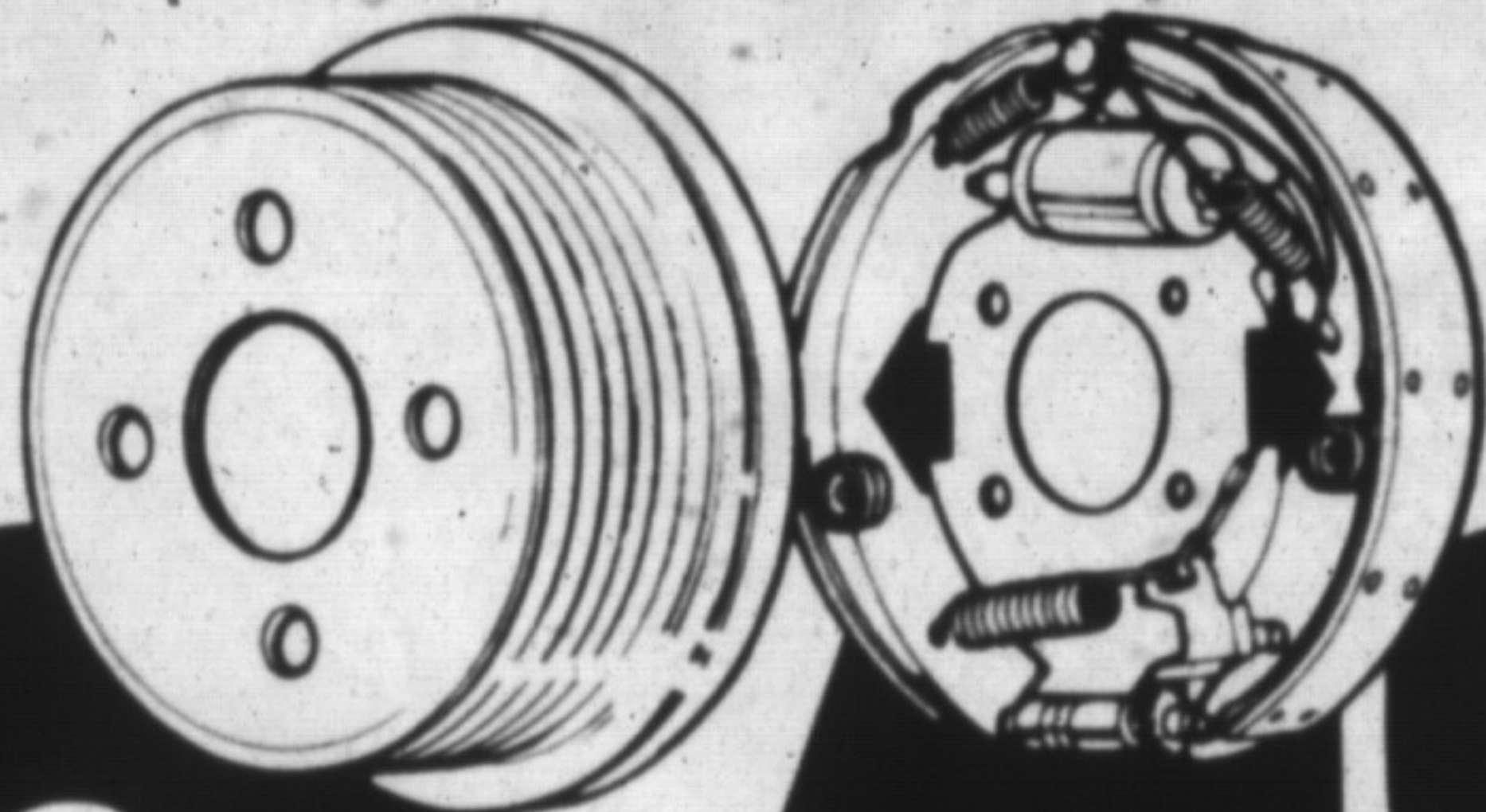

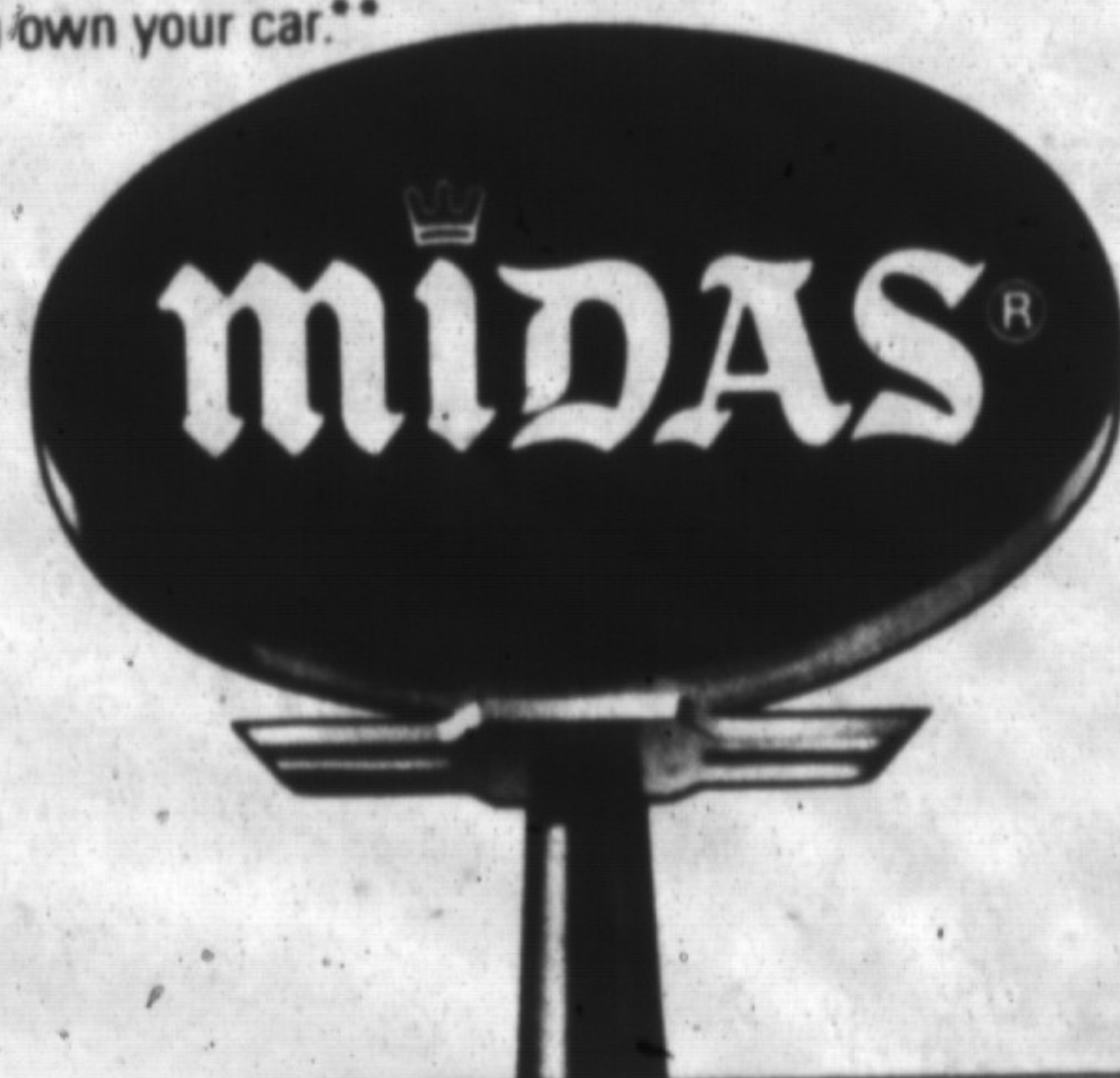
