

Mustangs whip their Georgetown rivals

The Milton District High School Mustangs didn't seem to let a weekend excursion to Massena, N.Y., faze them at all.

They returned from their outing to face Georgetown Rebels in Halton East High School Hockey League action Monday afternoon at John Tenehl Sports Centre and whipped their guests, 10-4.

The score could have been a lot more lopsided, but Milton coach Bob Pitt made sure everybody got equal ice time.

Jason Bahnman led the way for the Mustangs with a natural hat-trick (three consecutive, uninterrupted goals). Brothers Kidd and Scott McLeod each scored a pair while singles went to Kyle Hasselfeldt, Steve Henderson and Jim Speck.

"We're just gearing up for the playoffs now," said Pitt.

The Mustangs have their spot clinched but must win their final game Wednesday at Loyola and hope T.A. Blakelock loses their wrap-up match with the top team in the league, Oakville-Trafalgar.

Some local high school hockey enthusiasts are even starting to think Milton might challenge the undefeated OT for league supremacy. Pitt doesn't disagree.

"We can compete with any team in the league if we play our game and stay out of the penalty box," said Pitt.

The Mustangs got in a pair of games over the weekend when they

travelled to New York to take part in a small four-team invitational tournament. In addition to the host squad, the other two teams were from Potsdam, N.Y., and North Wood Prep School from Lake Placid.

The squad arrived at Massena Friday afternoon and played Potsdam Friday night, dropping a 9-5 decision which included a pair of Potsdam empty-net goals.

Scoring for Milton were Warren House, Kidd, and Scott McLeod, Mark Brimmerson and Paul Moreau. Sandy Stokes was between the pipes.

"Going down there I told all the boys that this was a meaningless tournament that had no prestige. Everybody was going to get equal ice time, and they did."

The squad's final game was Saturday afternoon against North Wood, a game they won 3-2. Doing the honours for the winners were Scott McLeod, Shawn Hasselfeldt and Brimmerson.

"We really didn't play a team game, we played as a bunch of individuals," was the only complaint Pitt had of his team.

Pitt said the team was impressed with the support of the town to the Americans' hockey program.

"When we got there, everybody knew who we were. Our game was broadcast on the local radio station, Friday night everybody went back and had a free pizza and chicken wings party with pop. Everything was first class."

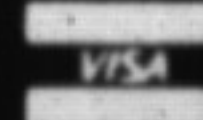
