

Drury nips Reding in junior wrestling

The next generation of high school wrestlers showed their stuff at Bishop Reding Secondary School in Milton Thursday.

The inaugural Halton Junior Wrestling championship was held

at Bishop Reding and E.C. Drury came away with the most medals, although official team statistics weren't kept.

Drury collected 13 medals while the host Royal squad was close be-

hind with 11. White Oaks with seven and Nelson with six rounded out the top four placings.

The Drury gold medalists were Chris Spence in the 116-lb. class, Jason Madden at 143 lbs., Jamie Madden at 149 lbs., Sean Savage at 173 lbs. and Eric Whyte at 190 lbs.

Nailing down silver medals were John Stevenson at 84 lbs.; Lee Black at 95 lbs.; Colin Widdis, 103.5 lbs.; Gary Collins, 130 lbs. and Rick Arseneault at 149 lbs.

Taking home bronze medals were Brent Pickett at 84 lbs., Dustin Delorey, 95 lbs. and Ryan Jeffrey at 143 lbs.

"This shows promise for the future of the team," said ECD coach Larry Jaroslawski after the meet.

For Bishop Reding, Brian Montgomery won silver at 158 lbs., while Paul Martins earned one 173 lbs. and Ted Van Dentloek at 220 lbs.

Taking home bronze medals from

the host squad were Harry Rinsma, 103.5 lbs., Ted Van Kestram, 116 lbs., Paul Hefferman, 120 lbs., Dante Mendoza, 124 lbs., Grank Mangialardi, 130 lbs., Giles Hodge, 136 lbs., Rich Murphy, 149 lbs., and Matt Herden, 173 lbs.

The next major event on the high school wrestling calendar takes place tomorrow at White Oaks in Oakville with the Halton championships, the first step on the road to OFSAA for the local competitors.
