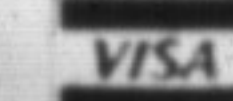

The proposed zoning by-law amendment would clarify and add certain definitions and permitted uses to By-law no. 61-85.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT OF BY-LAW

The proposed zoning by-law amendment would make the following amendments to By-law No. 61-85, as amended, being the Consolidated Zoning By-law of the Town of Milton passed on the 2nd day of July, 1985:

1. clarification that a "gas bar" is permitted use in a "C3" zone
2. to include indoor animal runs as a permitted use in the "A1" and "A2" zones
3. to include "video rental shop" as a permitted use in "C1", "C2" and "C3" zones
4. to prohibit parking areas within any site triangle
5. to restrict the height of industrial buildings in industrial zones to a maximum of two storeys or 8.5 metres, where the industrial zone abuts a residential zone
6. to clarify the permitted use of an equipment storage building for agricultural equipment only in an Agricultural zone
7. to prohibit open storage in a "C4" zone
