## Library has wide variety of videos

When is a book not a book? When it's a video. Nowadays, you'll find videos sandwiched among the books at Milton Public Library. Since January, VHS videos have been available to library members.

You can find an alphabetical listing of the videos at the information desk or you can check the card catalogue and locate videos the same way you would find a book -- by subject, author or title.

Three hundred titles are presently catalogued and still more videos appear regularly on the shelves.

The library looks upon its permanent video collection as resource material -- for information, instruction and self-improvement. Those of you who aspire to be gourmet cooks can make "chocolate and other divine desserts", prepare a Cajun meal, then host a formal dinner party.

Sports fans can watch Wayne Gretzky or relive the 1988 Winter Olympics.

Jane Fonda's workouts, tai chi, cross-country skiing, cycling, horseback riding, tap dancing and ice skating will keep you fit.

A four-volume series will help you find the job you want with tips on searching for a job, marketing yourself and surviving the interview.

Do-it-yourselfers will benefit from the 13-part home improvement series, e.g. drywall, kitchen cab-



inets, plumbing and electrical. Or there are basic and advanced car care and motorcycle maintenance.

Travel the world without paying a cent -- Australia, Israel, Japan, Spain, Great Britain, Mexico -- and learn some languages while you're at it.

PMS, child safety, AIDS, childbirth preparation, nutrition, abuse of the elderly, reproductive systems, and care of the newborn baby are among the health topics and social issues.

Environmental concerns include acid rain and industrial waste.

You can observe sharks, Canada geese, backyard birds, whales and African wildlife in the comfort of your home.

Improve your skills in sewing, silk-flower arranging, gardening, photography and videography.

*How to Marry a Millionaire* would appeal to me if I weren't already married. That, of course, would be followed by *How to Plan a Perfect Wedding*.

Inuit art, history of flight, ballet, speeches of Sir Winston Churchill and Martin Luther King, Canadian

authors, Einstein, Dr. Louis Leakey, DNA, architecture -- you name it, they've got it.

Next to the information desk at the library, you'll find two browsing units which display children's stories, the classics and feature films.

No doubt you're familiar with *Alice in Wonderland*, *Sleeping Beauty*, *Mary Poppins*, *Curious George*, *Pollyanna* and Hans Christian Andersen's tales.

The classics include many Shakespearean plays (*Othello*, *Merchant of Venice*, *Hamlet*) as well as *High Noon* and *Singin' in the Rain*.

In addition to purchasing videos, the library rents 50 feature films for three-month periods. Here's a sampling of the movies available until the end of March -- *A Passage to India*, *Crocodile Dundee*, *Harry and the Hendersons*, *Short Circuit*, *The Empire Strikes Back*, *Throw Mama from the Train* and *White Nights*.

All videos may be borrowed for two days at no cost. You can renew them once, as long as there's no waiting list. You pay \$1 for overdue videos.

If the video you wish to see is already out on loan, you may reserve it at the information desk and you will be notified when it is returned to the library.

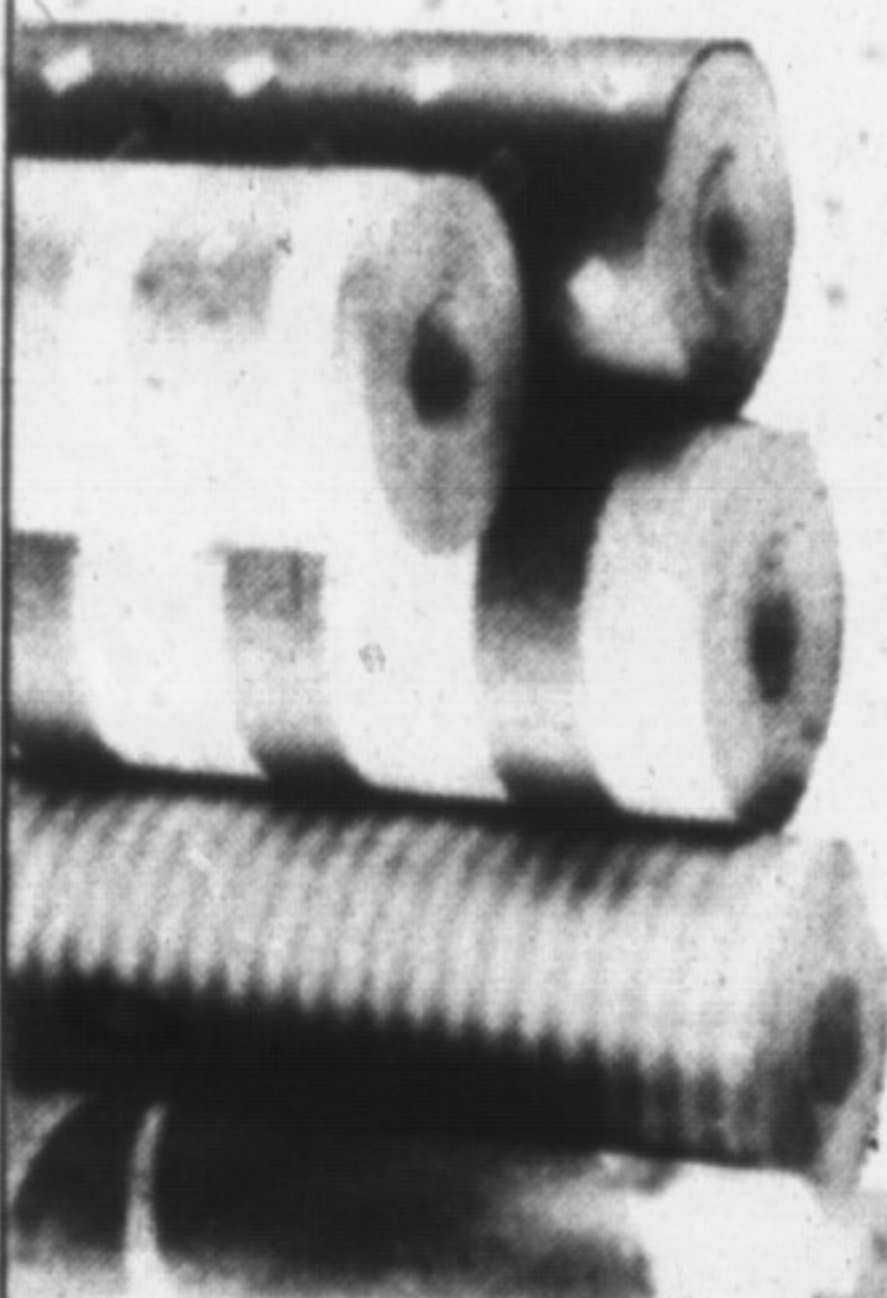

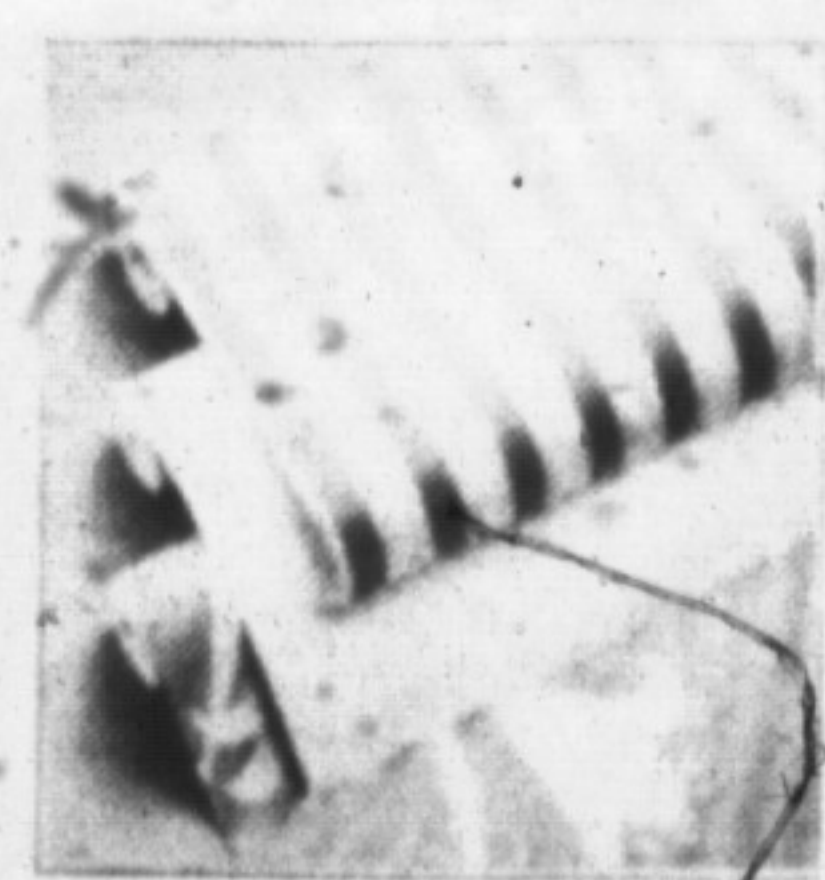

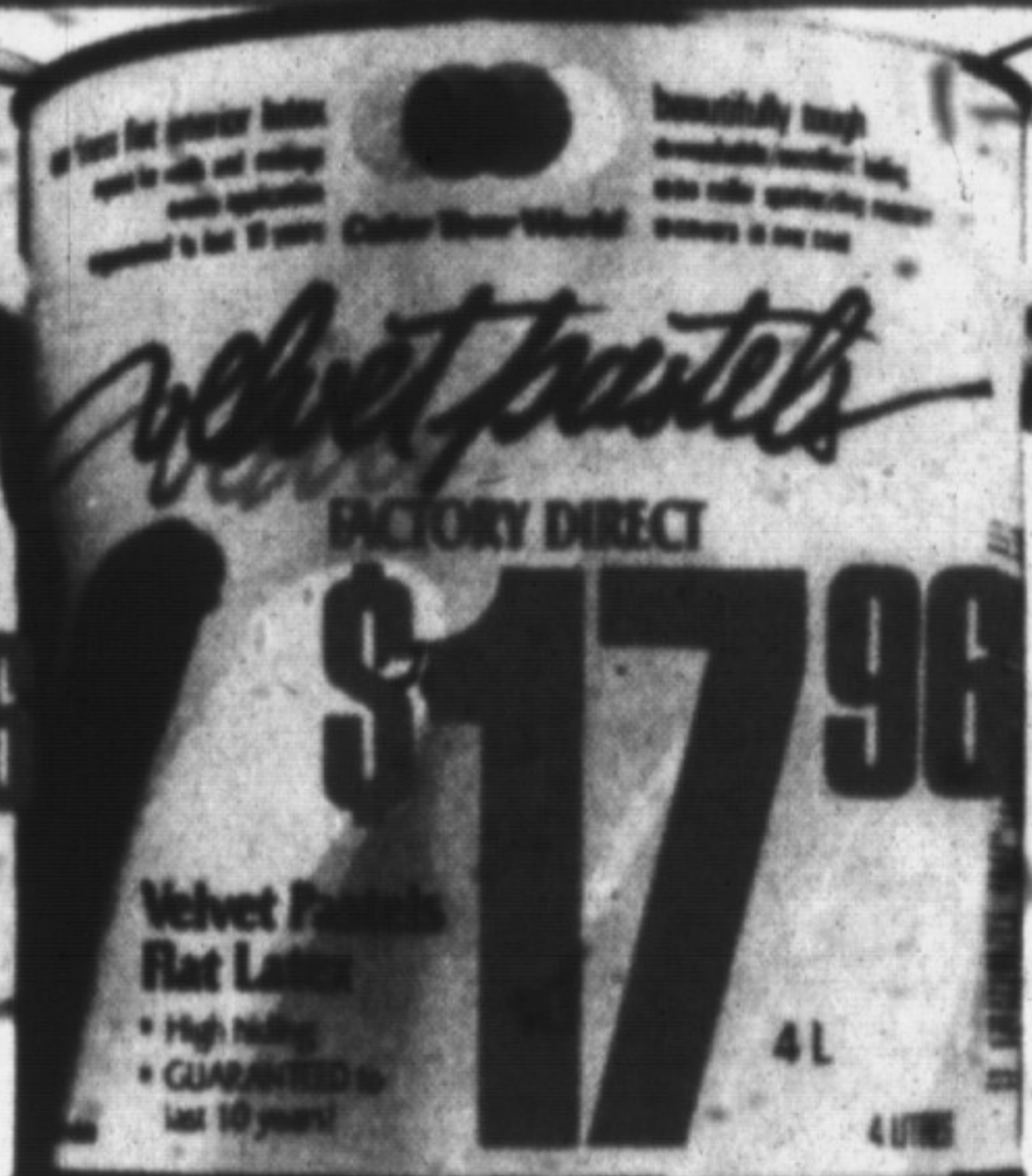
