"I'm just glad I didn't grow up in Oakville," he laughed.

There are probably a couple of coaches in Oakville who would give their eye teeth to have him.

Partridge, for one, would love to have someone of Livingstone's or Hinkson's calibre as his backcourt mate.

"I've practised with these guys and I knew how good they are," said Partridge, who made five of eight treys. "I knew they were both capable of those types of games."

The game was close at the half with the West leading 52-45.

But it didn't stay that way as the West ignited like a northern brush fire in the second half.

Before anyone knew what happened the West was out in front 74-52 at the 13:18 mark.

East bench-boss Jim Noble

looked a little concerned on the sidelines but he remembered last year's classic when the East trailed by 18 points before rallying for an 89-81 victory. A comeback win nearly materialized again.

"Once we started to come back, they went really cold," said Noble.

"They really took it to us early in the second half," said Partridge. At the time the six-foot-three guard was riding the pines with an itchy trigger finger. "They seemed to hit every three-pointer they shot."

"I didn't think I would be shooting as well as I did," added Partridge, who sported a Hawaiian tan.

"Nobody was looking to to shoot, so I started looking for the shot before the pass," he said. "That is something I don't normally do."

This wasn't a normal game which made it permissible.

Livingstone came alive in the latter stages of the contest, scoring 10 points to give the West a 100-91 lead. This inspired Partridge to rattle off nine straight points of his own to keep the East close.

The score was 105-102 when Hans took a court-length pass from Hinkson and stretched the West lead to 107-102.

Partridge hit a three-pointer (what else?) to cut the margin to 107-105.

On paper the West was a much superior team. They sported seasoned veterans Michael and Kevin La-Rose of Burlington Central, however the pair was held to a combined nine points.

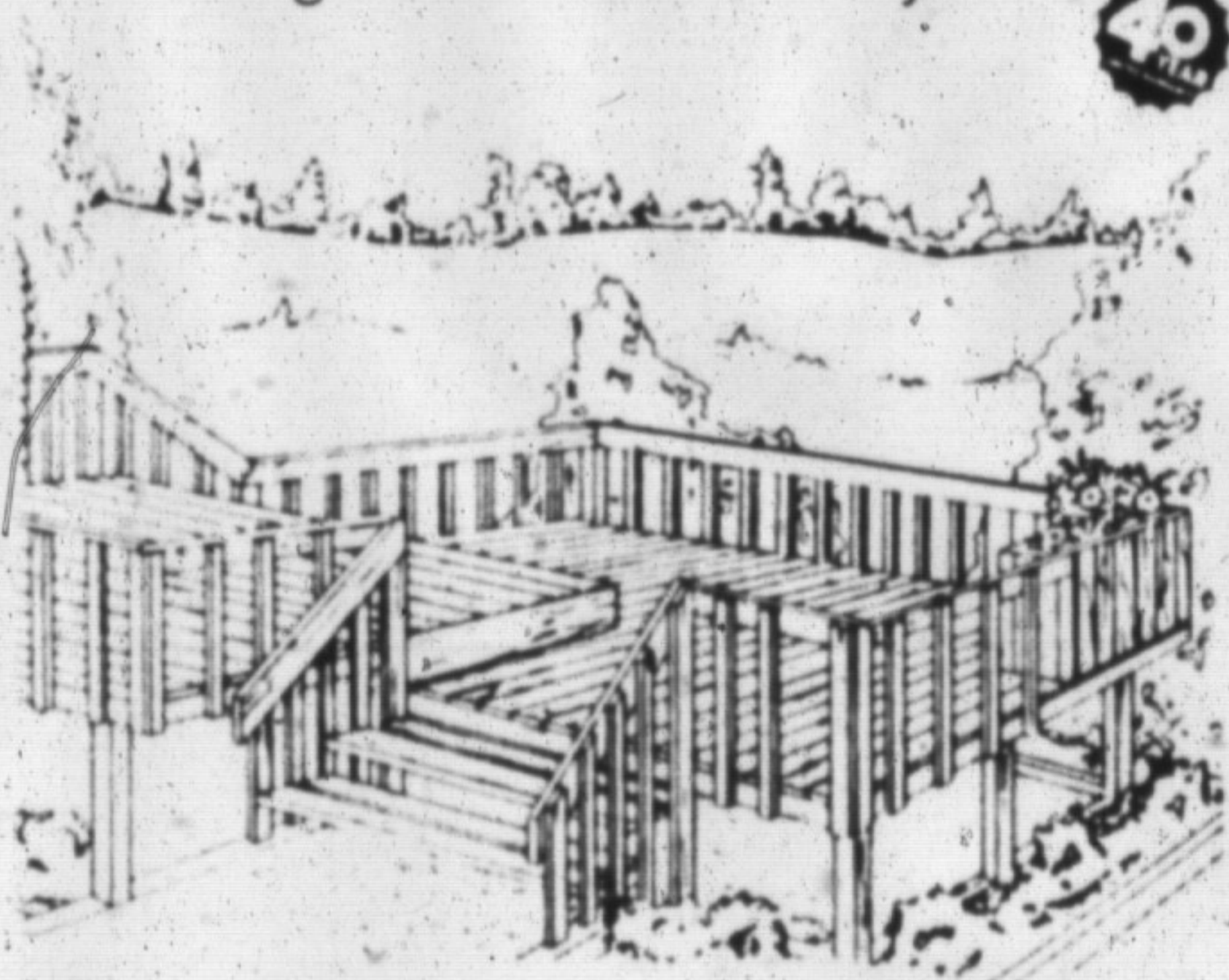
"We weren't really as serious as they were," admitted Partridge.
