

## Thieves net \$13,200 in heist at Fitness Technique

Halton Police are seeking assistance in identifying suspects involved in the entry and theft from Fitness Technique, a store located at 190 Main Street East, Milton.

Sometime during the night of Sunday, April 9, the property of Fitness Technique was entered and \$13,200 worth of clothing and sports equipment was stolen. At approximately 11:30 p.m. a suspicious yellow 16-foot rental truck was seen in the area.

The stolen property included a muscle tech rowing machine, 10 wet suits, four dumbbells, two pulse monitors, five cycle computers, a large number of Timex watches and Bula bracelets, numerous weight lifting and cycling gloves, weight lifting belts, and clothing.

## Knife-wielding man charged

A 45-year-old man was held for a bail hearing after being arrested on weapons charges.
