## Roxul T-ball squad loses to Oakville in finals of tourney

The Milton Roxul senior T-ball squad travelled to Guelph on the weekend and made it to the finals of the tournament before losing to Oakville, 23-19.

In their opening game of the tournament, Milton crushed Cambridge, 28-5. John Nadalin and Kris MacDonald had four hits and scored four runs each for the Roxul squad. Brian Loughlin and Jack Turner had three runs and hits apiece.

In their second game, Milton rocked to an 18-6 win over Brantford. Defensively, Jamie Sweetland made two fielding gems from left field. James Rooke and Bobby McKnight also made nice running catches. Offensively, Jason Rehn and Jeff Morgan each had three hits and scored two runs.

The two wins put Milton into the semifinal game, where Milton took on arch-rival Clarkson. Both teams came out slugging, with the Bandits of Clarkson holding 6-5, 9-5 and 11-9 leads over the first three innings. Then the Roxul boys silenced the the Bandit bats and Clarkson scored only three runs over the final two innings. Milton rallied with six runs over the same time to nip the Bandits 15-14.

Jonathon Glover had two hits and made a couple of su-

perb putouts at home plate. Offensively, Scott Neal and Jeff Chiasson led the way with three hits apiece, while Chris Hunt smashed a two-run homer.

Milton was also able to turn one of baseball's rarest occurrences, a triple play. With Clarkson runners on first and third, first baseman Chiasson fielded a hot grounder and stepped on first. He then threw the ball to MacDonald, who tagged the runner from first base for the second out. The runner from second hesitated before taking off so MacDonald threw to Nadalin at third, who applied the tag for the third out.

In the final, the Roxul entry locked horns with the Oakville A's in a classic battle. The first three innings of the game belonged to Milton as they built up a 13-10 lead. From then on the Oakville bats came alive.

In the fourth inning the A's grabbed the lead for the first time, 16-15. In the final frame Oakville stretched their lead to 23-19. Milton sluggers with three hits apiece were Rooke, MacDonald, Morgan, Sweetland, McKnight and Neal. Loughlin had four hits, which included a bases-loaded triple. When added to his defence, Loughlin's play was good enough to earn him the MVP award.
