Drug trafficking charges laid

Police investigated a party at a downtown drinking establishment on June 16 at 10:45 p.m. and arrested a Milton man, 23, and charged him with possession of restricted drugs and possession for trafficking. Ontario Street apartment complex. The tires were all slashed and the paint scratched.

Mischief at restaurant

On June 18 at 6 p.m. at Harvey's Restaurant on Main Street an intoxicated Hamilton man, 31, was arrested and charged with mischief after he allegedly knocked over a counter and caused \$700 damage. He is to appear in court July 24.

Car stripped

Professional thieves are at work in Milton. Last week a Nissan 200ZX had its inside stripped during the night.

Last Friday morning the owner of the car who asked not to be identified, saw that a window was broken and everything inside was taken.

The car stereo, part of the stick shift and even the seats were missing. Police told the victim that it was likely the work of professionals.

The car owner's father, said he heard a car horn between 2 a.m. and 3 a.m. but didn't see anything unusual. "To do this so fast and efficiently is not the work of kids."

Police said the thieves pried the window off to get inside the car. They also said that gloves were used, so no fingerprints were found.

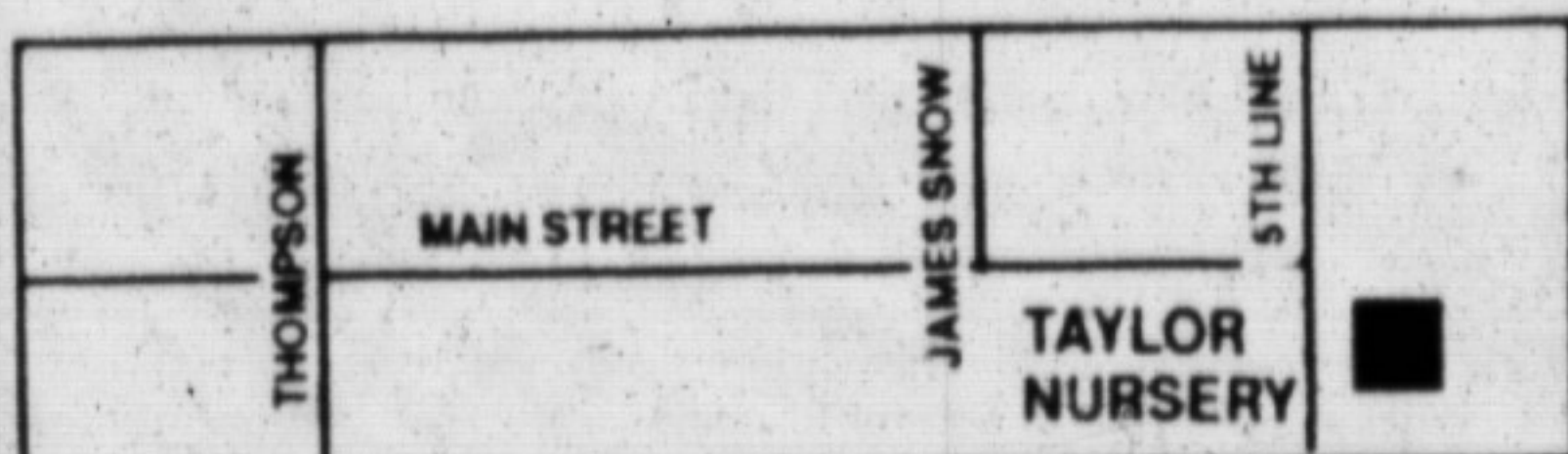

Timothy Leece was well known in Milton. The family have lived here for more than 14 years. On Sunday the Leece house was filled with dozens of friends and family. Mr. Leece's uncle was impressed with the number of people who came by to express their sympathy. "There were kids everywhere. They even had to park the cars at the mall, there was no other room." Mr. Leece had ridden trail bikes for

a number of years and was quite experienced according to family members. "Knowing him and how experienced he was, I really can't understand it," said Gary Leece.

The two cyclists who were struck, Douglas Sparks, 37, and Anthony Stockloser, 41, are neighbours on Masla Drive in Oakville. Mr. Sparks was transported to Sunnybrook Medical Centre where he is listed in good condition. Mr. Stockloser was listed in stable condition after surgery Saturday at Oakville Trafalgar Hospital.
