Halton District Women's Institute's 88th District Annual centered on the theme "Around the World with ACWW" (Associated Country Women of the World). All 12 Branches designed posters, displayed artifacts and products from member countries.

District president Norma Alexander recounted how ACWW evolved over the years. We currently have a membership of 9.5 million women. In cooperation with UNESCO, we are working on "Water For All" projects.

Scholarships funded by ACWW are available to young women from Third World Countries. These women return home with new skills, usually in health or education, to work.

In honour of the theme, a special "Loaf of Bread Collection" was held before lunch. We raised \$108.45 for the Jubilee fund. Several Halton Women's Institute members will be attending the ACWW tri-annual conference in Kansas City, Missouri in

September. Ottawa will host a smaller ACWW conference in June, 1990. Helga Schwartz and Hazel Stewart presented a workshop on safe food handling recently.

They reminded us to wash the tap as well as our hands, utensils and knives when we are through working with raw meat. Harmful bacteria can multiply rapidly and cause severe illness, even death. Cathy Anthony from Gloggers Travel presented many sensible suggestions in her travel tips workshop.

For example, keep a list of your travellers cheque numbers at home as well as with you. If you need to take prescription drugs, have them authorized before you leave the country.

Our Women's Institute theme from 1989 to 1990 will be the environment.
