## Just for kicks

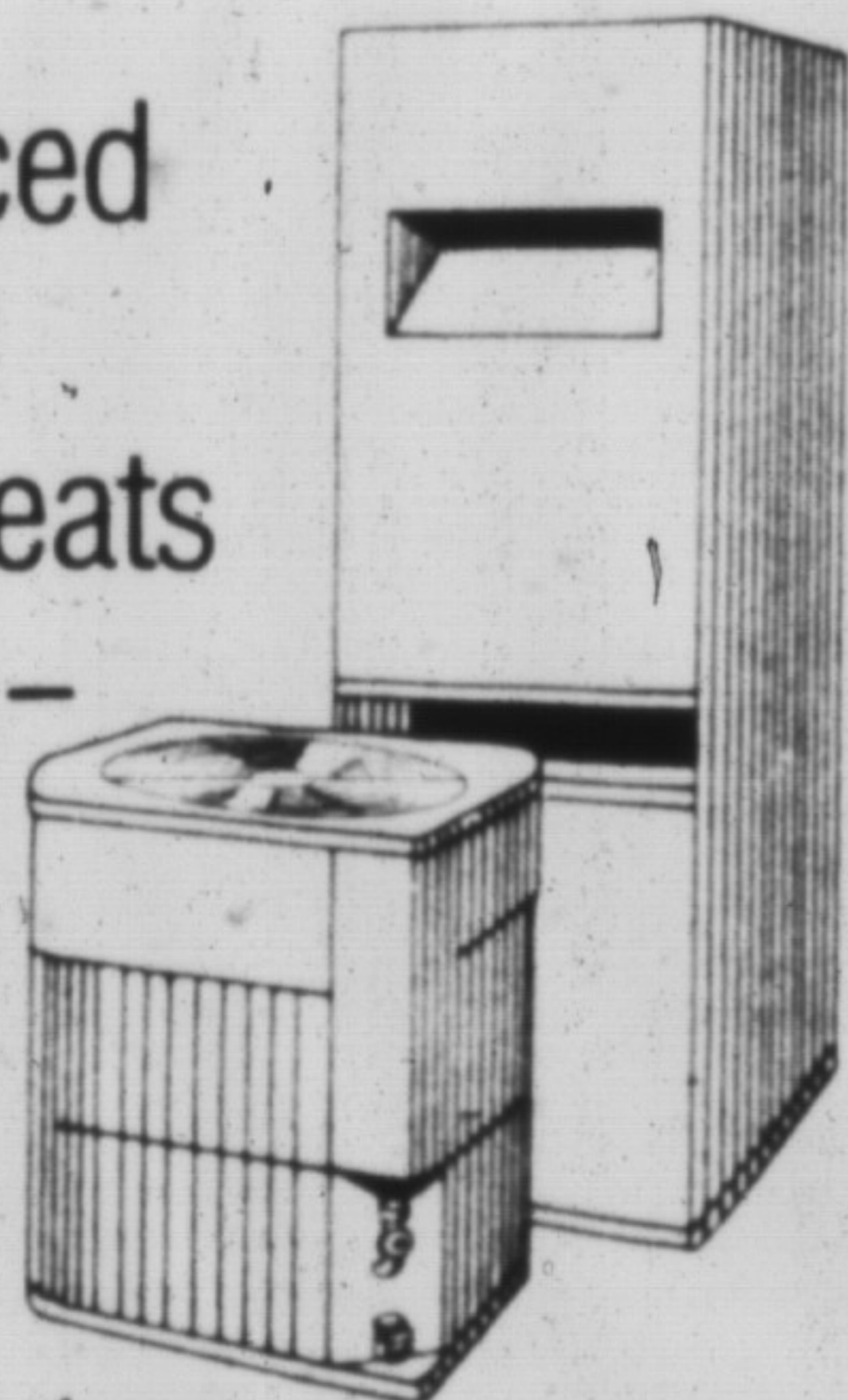
