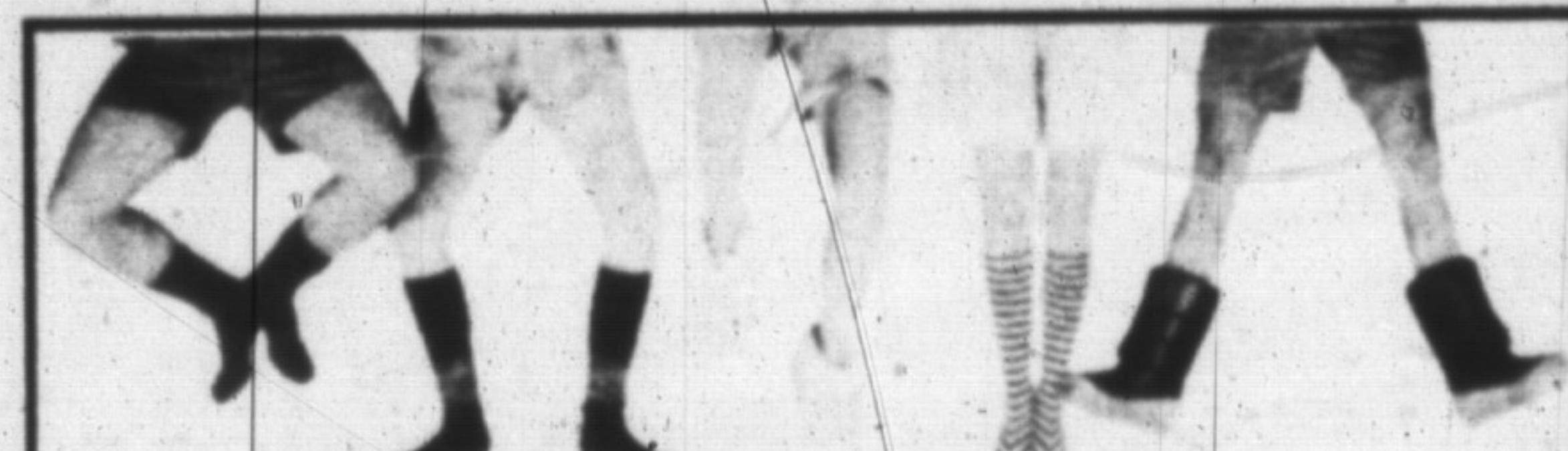
Along with her title, Miss Stewart received one year's use of a Chrysler LeBaron convertible, which she said she finds quite a luxury.
