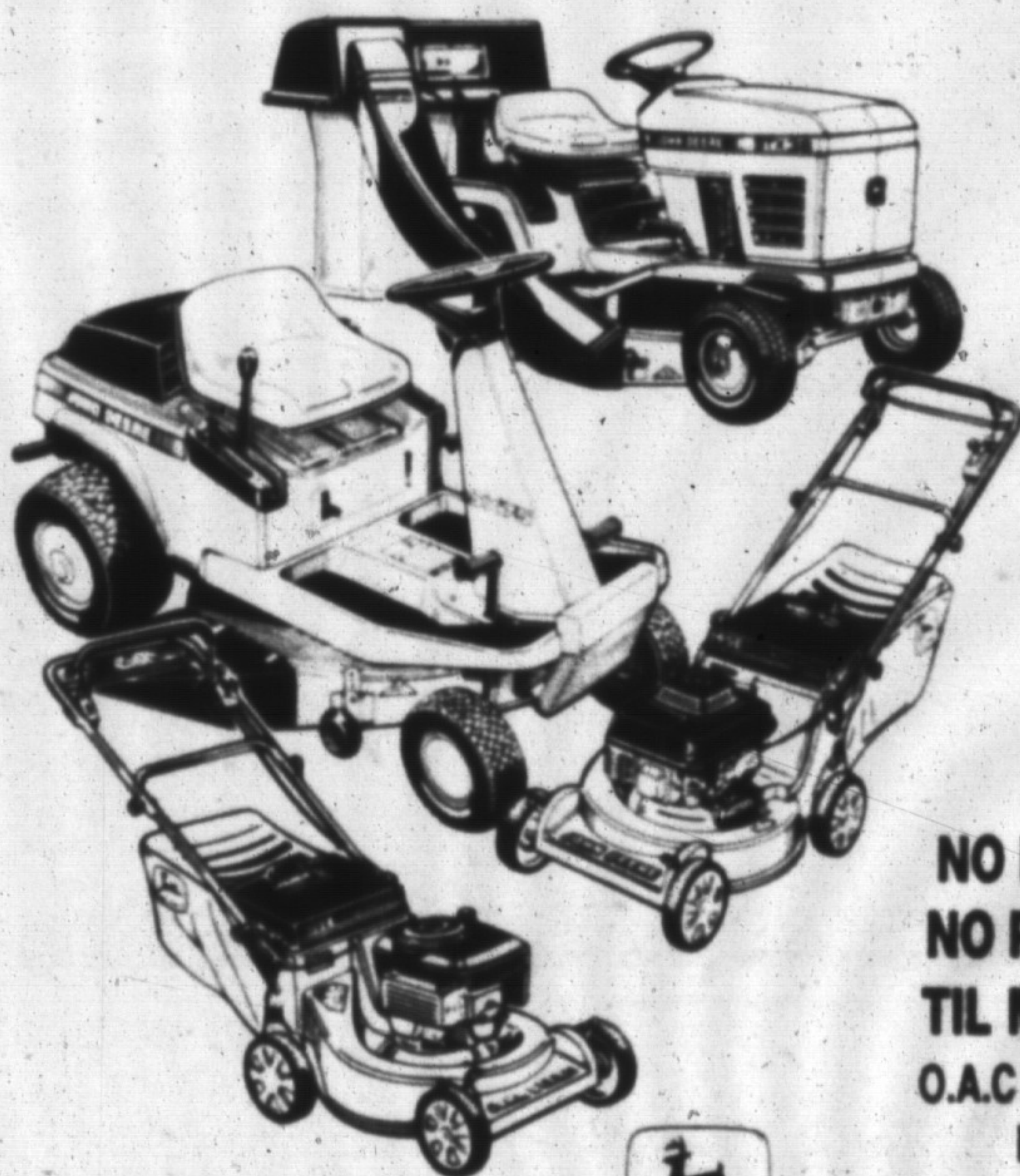
Sponsor Dennis Gluck's convert sadly spelled the end of the '89 season for the 'Too little, too late' Motormen.
