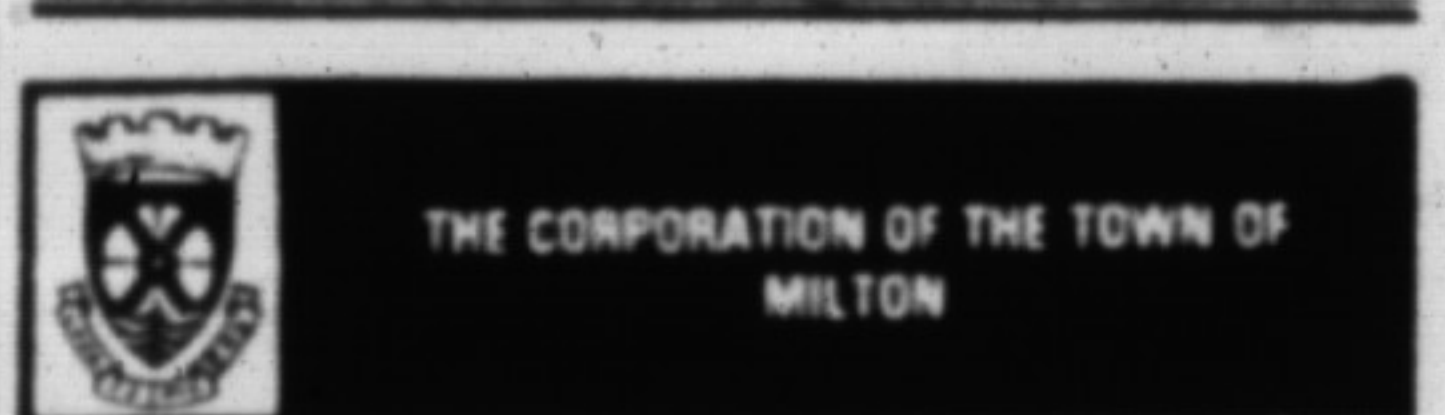

The proposed stopping up and closing of a municipal road allowance between Lots 3 and 4, Concession 3 of the former Township of Nassagaweya in the County of Halton, now in the Town of Milton, Regional Municipality of Halton - No. 3 Sideroad.
