ton councillor Bill Johnson said he disagreed with MNR's contention that the deer population is stable. He suggested the deer have been forced by development into smaller and smaller areas.

A total of 65 deer were killed on roads in 1988, compared with 69 deer

The Ministry uses road kill data as a population indicator. Mr. Johnson said the numbers of deer killed in traffic accidents remains stable not because there are similar numbers of deer from year to year, but because the 20 complaints registered in 1986. they are forced out onto the roads by the decreasing area which they have to roam.

Farmers in Halton insist upon a controlled deer hunt because of damage to fields. Just under \$50,000 in crop damage by deer was reported by Halton farmers to MNR last year. A further \$26,000 in nursery and orchard damage was reported.

The Regional agreement forests are posted with the hunting dates and

tags. Hunters are also required to wear blaze orange vests to increase visibility and safety.

From 1986 through 1988 the number of deer killed in the hunt has remained relatively stable. Last year 154 deer were killed in Halton.

The number of hunters, however, has risen dramatically. In 1986 there were 420 licensed participants in the controlled deer hunt. By 1988 there were 585 licences granted. But also in 1988, there were only five huntingrelated complaints reported to officials. That is down significantly from

The Ministry estimates that 50 deer are taken each year in the archery portion of the hunt, with the remainder

killed in the four-day shotgun hunt. Increased patrols and public awareness initiatives have worked to lessen incidents and complaints, according

to MNR. Oakville regional councillor Janet Mitchell said during a September meeting which looked at the issue, " don't think the Region should allow hunting on its property. The Halton Region Conservation Authority (HRCA) has put a stop to it and so should we."
