"An opportunity like this doesn't come along too often," said Ward 2 councillor Brad Clements. Except for service station kiosks which he said are often unmanned, councillor Clements noted that such a facility "would be the only one on the 401 between Sarnia and Toronto."

Councillor Les Laughren voiced concerns about how much the project, if approved, would end up

costing the town.

Mayor Gord Krantz said, "it is not my intention it cost the town any money. It would not have gotten my support if it was going to cost hundreds of thousands of dollars. There might be a small investment (by the town) "but we will get it back quickly," Mr. Krantz said.

Such a facility is seen as a major boom to the host municipality because once tourists are off the highway they will probably spend some time and money in the community.

The information centre had been planned for Mississauga, but high land prices forced the ministry to scrub that plan.
